Rectory Room future in doubt

Plans to refurbish the ailing Rectory Room took a knock at the January meeting of the Parish Council (PC) when the Chairman, Gerry Stevenson, announced that funds from the Solar Park could not be used for church or school projects. The rooms are owned by the Church and managed by the Landulph Parochial Church Council (PCC). The building is in urgent need of repair, particularly to the outdated wiring and the internal plaster work. The Chairman made the announcement ahead of the regular public forum section of January's meeting. A number of parishioners had attended in the hope of persuading the PC to make a grant to the PCC from solar park funds. Several parishioners who had attended to press for grants for the school were also disappointed.

New parish councillor

Phillip Braund, a lifelong resident of Landulph, has been co-opted to the Parish Council to replace Mac Armstrong who has resigned for personal reasons. Mac stepped down from the Parish Council in December. Chairman, Gerry Stevenson writes, 'On behalf of the Council and the parish as a whole, I would like to express our appreciation for his service to the parish, initially as a Council member, but more recently as Vice-Chairman. He has engaged in lively and sometimes challenging debates at Council meetings. He has pushed us forward into the technological age. Most recently he has been instrumental in proposing the potential benefits a public access defibrillator could bring to the community. He has also worked hard physically to maintain the environment of the Penyoke playing field, with tree cutting and removal, and many other activities. Many thanks Mac, for all you have done for us, and we wish you well for the future'.

Chris Wyman replaces Mac as PC Vice-Chairman.

Parish to get defibrillator

A defibrillator is to be installed in Landulph, probably at the Memorial Hall. The device, which is designed to restore a malfunctioning heart to its proper rhythm, is a crucial part of first response to heart attack victims. The defibrillator would be installed on the outside wall of the Hall and be available to any member of the public. Instructions for the automated device are printed on the case and are simple to follow. However, the charity installing the unit, Heartswell, will be offering training, including general first aid, to up to 30 parishioners. The cost of the unit will depend on type and installation and also on local fundraising. The Council is likely to cover the cost of the required electricity supply.

Some members of the public had suggested the unit should be installed more centrally in the village at the junction between Fore Street and Coombe Lane but it was pointed out there was no electricity supply here and that the Hall was closer to the centre of the wider population of the parish as a whole.

Parish precept soars 10 per cent

The Parish Council agreed in December to increase the parish precept (the local element of County Council rates) by an exceptional 10 per cent. The increase is needed to provide a fund for the on-going maintenance of the Penyoke playground which has fallen into disrepair recently partly due to lack of funds. A 10 per cent rise is equivalent to a £3.49 per annum increase in annual rates for a Band D householder. The income from the increase will be ring-fenced for the playing field.

Lane named

The short link road between Penyoke Lane and Church Lane, sometimes known as Back Lane, is to be merged with Penyoke Lane. Dual language street signs will be put up in Church Lane and Penyoke Lane. Due to the obscurity of some of the smaller alleys in the parish residents are advised to have carefully prepared, clear directions ready to give to emergency services when the need arises.

Horse v car – confrontation continues

The Parish Council continues to receive complaints from both riders and drivers, about highway code violations in our lanes. Council Chairman, Gerry Stevenson, pleads with both sides to abide by the Highway Code guidelines and to exercise restraint and courtesy.

Drivers: Pass wide and slowly. Riders are often children, so take extra care. Horses walking two abreast may be escorting a young or inexperienced rider. Always slow down and be prepared to stop. Horses can be unpredictable, despite the efforts of the rider.

Riders: Wear light-coloured or fluorescent clothes in daylight and reflective clothing at night or in poor visibility. Never ride more than two abreast, and ride in single file on narrow or busy roads and when riding round bends. Do listen carefully for the sound of oncoming traffic.

School News

This is due to expand to become the South East Cornwall Multi Academy Regional Trust (SMART). The priority for SMART is to ensure the continuity and quality of education for all of the young people in our local area.



Wheels to Work

Some readers may find the following information useful.

Wheels to Work is a charity which hires out motorcycles to young people. The aim is to help people who live in an area with no public transport to become mobile and travel to work independently. This may be particularly relevant for anyone on shift or weekend working.

A clean provisional or full driving licence is required, and applicants must have completed a Compulsory Bike Training Test. Those of 16 years of age may only use a 50cc bike, but this rises to 125cc at age 17.

The main criterion for people to qualify for *Wheels to Work* is that they have an offer of (or are in) employment. The whole of Cornwall is covered, and bikes can be serviced at the user's place of work or at their home address.

Charges range from £30 to £36 a week, and include insurance, road tax and servicing as well as roadside recovery. Further information can be found on parish noticeboards, and anyone interested can call the charity on 01209 718888 or e-mail to cornwallw2w@aol.com
