Climate Matters: Reuse, Recycle, Reduce. Highlighting changes in Cornwall Council's waste management collection services (reduce and recycle) and Saltash Scrapstore's success at showing how items some consider scrap are of use to others (recycle and reuse).</li> <li>5th March. Climate Matters: Buses, EV's and Footpaths.</li> <li>NATURE RECOVERY.</li> <li>Sustainable farming. Successful second visit to Tom Derham's farm following an open invitation to the parish.</li> <li>Mapping Endangered Species. Hedgehog activity is still being added to Parish Online. The group wish to map other species: for example, avocets, curlews and bats.</li> <li>Forest of Cornwall. The copse, planted in 2021, on the outskirts of the cricket ground has been given new tree protectors, recycled from the Pentille estate. With maintenance, most of the trees are doing well.</li> <li>ENERGY. Our thermal imaging camera will be promoted during January/February to coincide with more sustained cold weather.</li> <li>PUBLIC TRANSPORT. The group wish to analyse results from the Rame User Group public transport survey. This was a successful, in-depth survey that could be replicated in time for our Climate Matters evening in March.</li> <li>NETWORKING.</li> <li>Tamar Valley National Landscape. Launch for name change and logo attended by LCG. Representative from LCG has spent time with their Development Officer discussing ways to map landscape recovery.</li> <li>C&amp;loS Local Nature Recovery Strategy.
