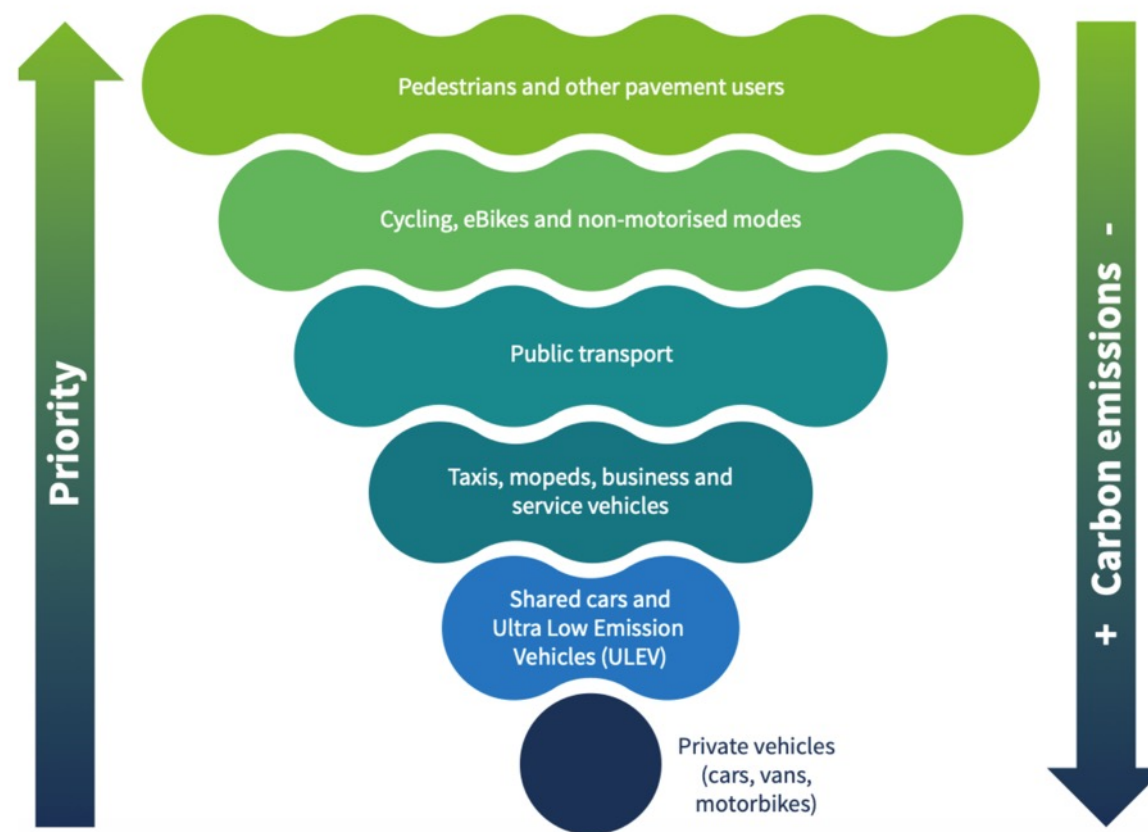

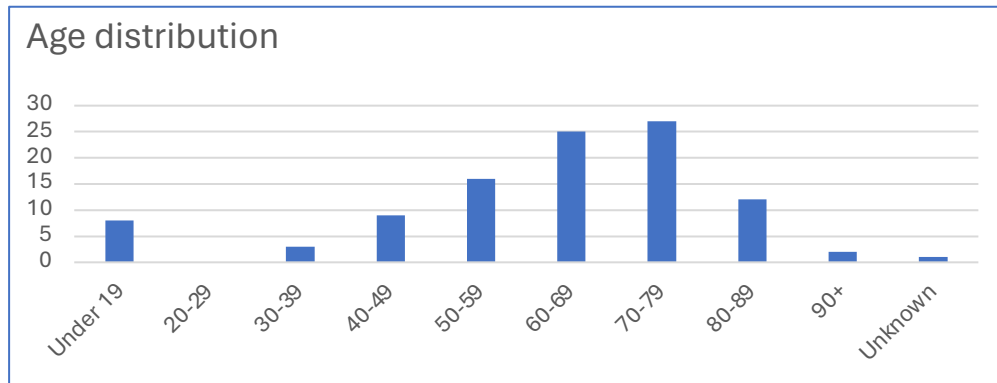

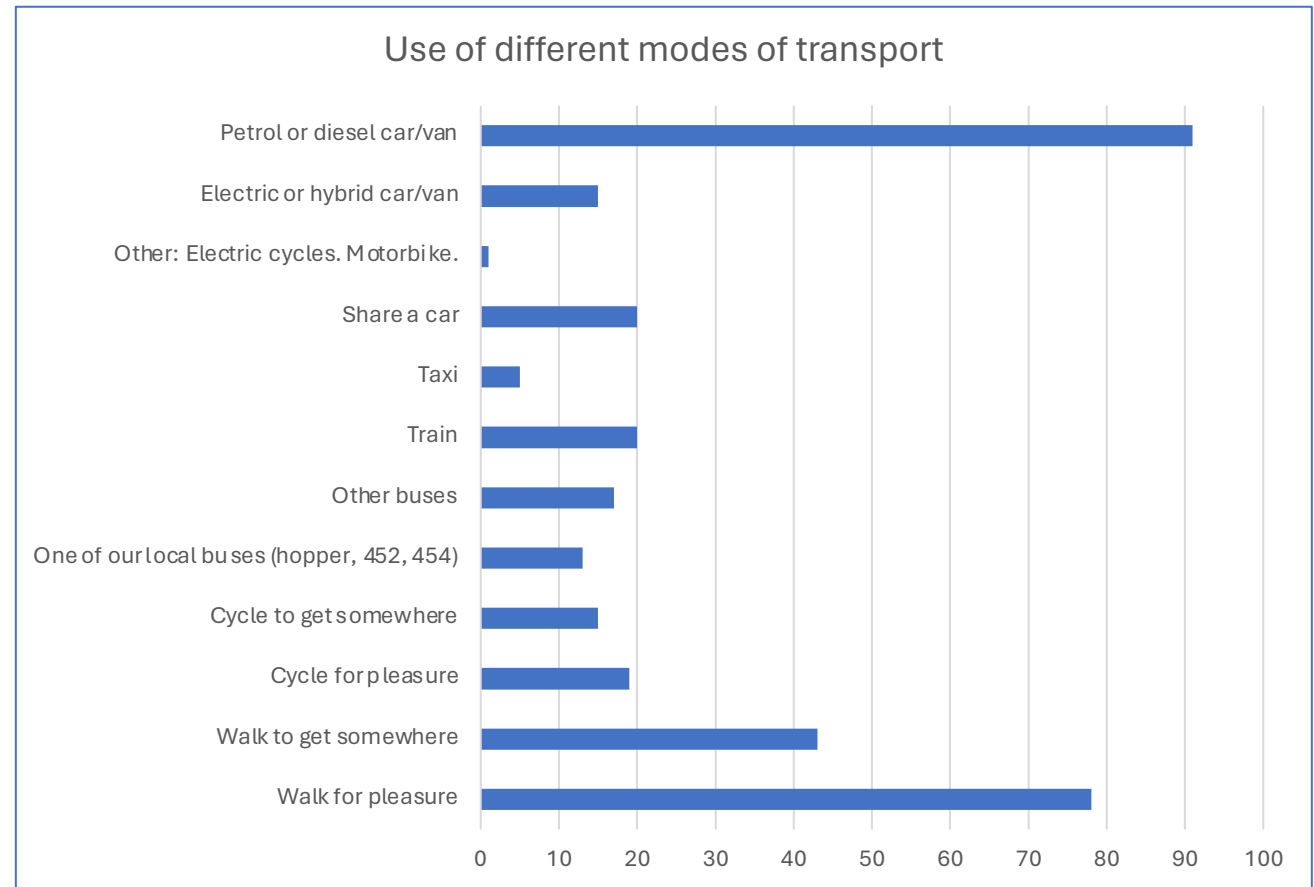


Who answered the transport survey

Modes of transport



- 12 people could not drive and 2 did not have access to a car
- 101 live in the parish
- Only 12 regularly work outside the parish

Transport Survey – Buses Key Findings

- **Who uses buses**

- 26 people use a bus
- 71 people had suggestions about improving bus services
- Overall general support for existing services particularly the Hopper Bus
- Some lack of knowledge about existing services

- **Suggestions for improvement to timetables (62 people)**

- Direct service
- Daily services, weekend services
- More buses per day
- Service needed for students travelling to school in Plymouth by train
- More reliable



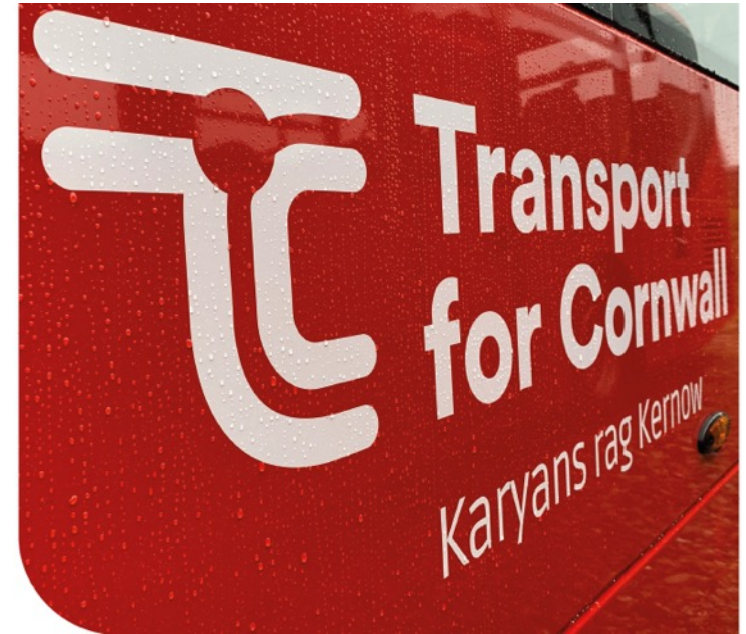

Long-held ambition to have a single, unifying brand for public transport in Cornwall to:

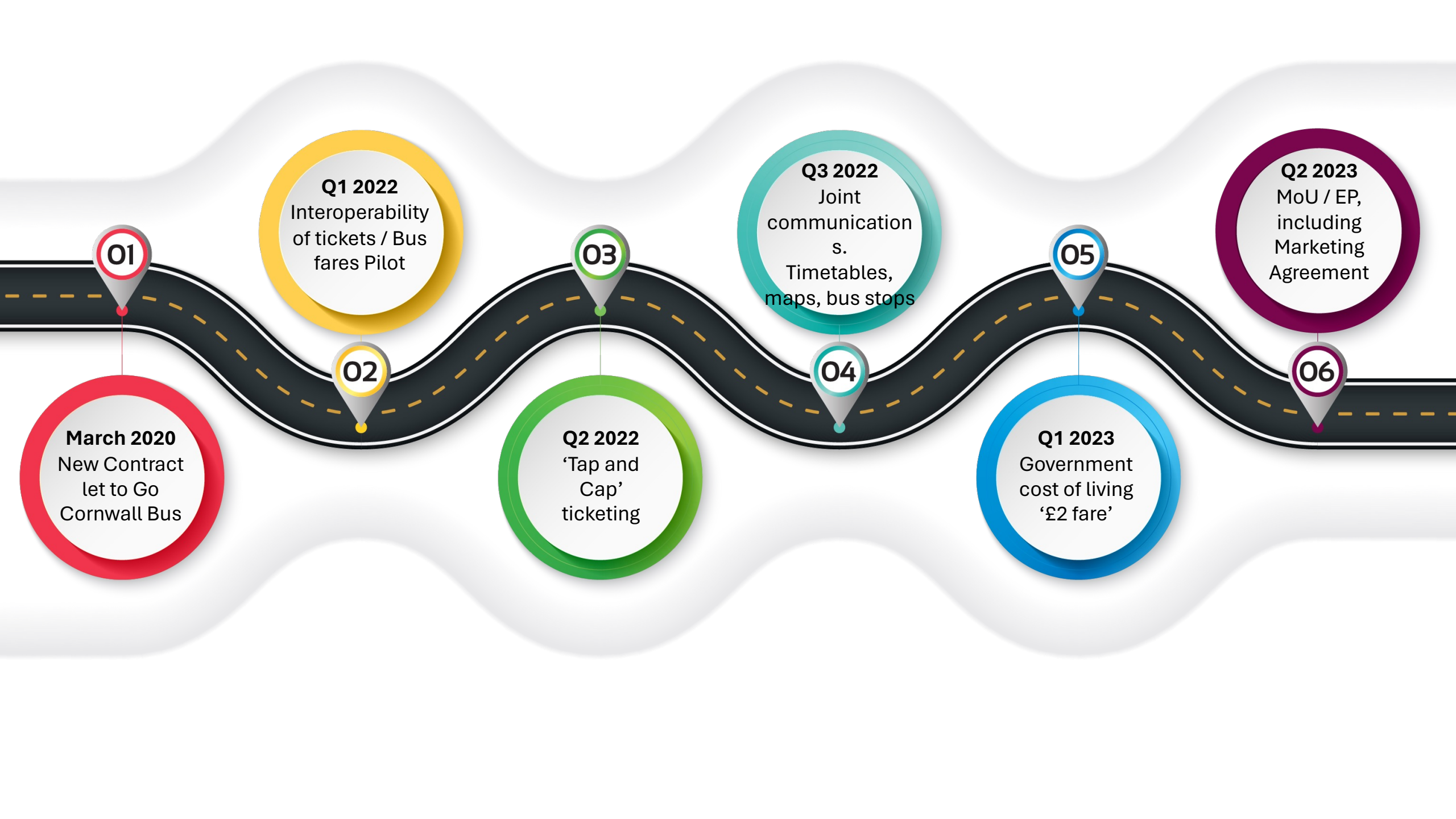
- Make public transport easier to understand and use

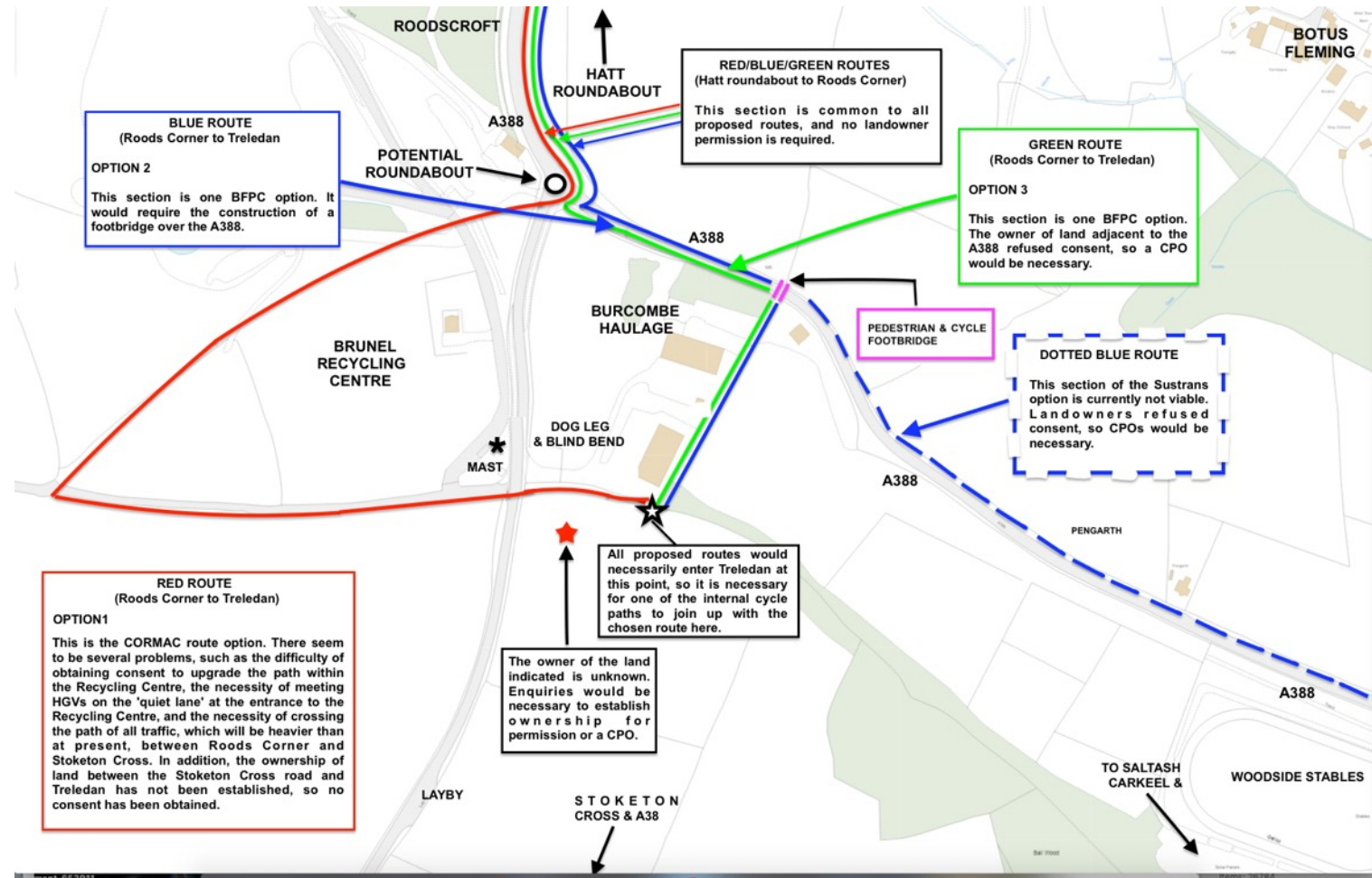

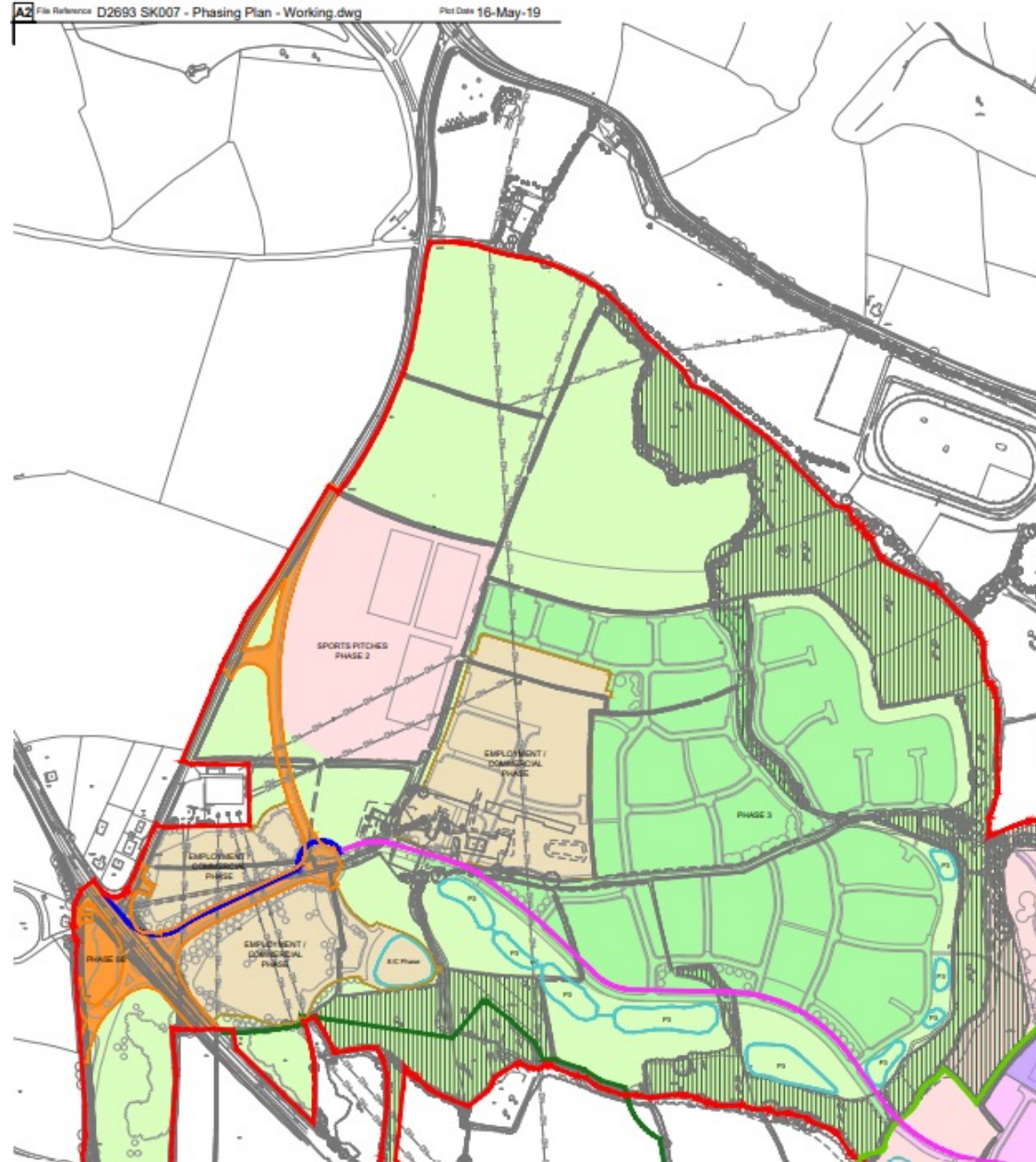

Transport Survey – Electric vehicles key findings

• Usage of electric vehicles

- 91 people regularly use a petrol/diesel vehicle but only 15 use an electric vehicle
- 12 people live in a household with at least one electric vehicle
- 50 people commented on electric vehicles

• Electric vehicle charging

- People with an electric vehicle either have a charge point (9) or use a normal electric socket (3)
- My hybrid does not need charging
- 13 people plan to switch to an electric vehicle but 8 of these have nowhere to install a charge point
- 4 people would use a public charge point in the Parish

• Attitude to electric vehicles (10 people)

- Expensive, technology short lived, limited range, limited charging points



Why we need to act

In 2019, Cornwall Council declared a Climate Emergency and in support of this the Cornwall Transport Plan sets a goal to have a carbon neutral transport network by 2030.

One key component of this plan is the transition to electric cars and vans. Electric vehicles (EVs) produce zero tailpipe emissions, and have significantly lower carbon emissions over their lifetime, for example, after accounting for emissions released during battery and vehicle manufacture and fuel production.¹

To facilitate the transition, an expansion of public EV charging infrastructure in Cornwall is needed.

Our vision

“To facilitate EV uptake through the development of a high-quality, comprehensive network of EV chargepoints across urban, rural and coastal Cornwall, contributing towards our goal of a carbon neutral transport network by 2030.”

What do we want to achieve?

By 2030, we want to see:



An extensive EV charging network so that the lack of access to charging is no longer a barrier to switching to an EV.



Fair access to chargepoints across urban, rural and coastal communities.



An inclusive, high-quality experience when using public chargepoints in Cornwall.



Reduced carbon emissions, in line with our target to be carbon neutral by 2030, and better air quality.



Contracts with public chargepoint operators which are cost-neutral (or income-generating to support wider service delivery if appropriate) for the council.

What is driving the EV transition?

The transition to EVs is being driven by the need to address a range of related challenges, both nationally and locally. These include:



Political – Action is needed to fulfil policy commitments, including the council’s aim to be carbon neutral by 2030.



Environmental – Whilst UK greenhouse emissions are falling, transport is the worst-performing sector. EVs are part of the solution.



Societal – Reducing air pollution will benefit public health and investing in public chargepoints supports a fairer transition.



Technological – Vehicle manufacturers are offering a wider choice of increasingly affordable EVs.



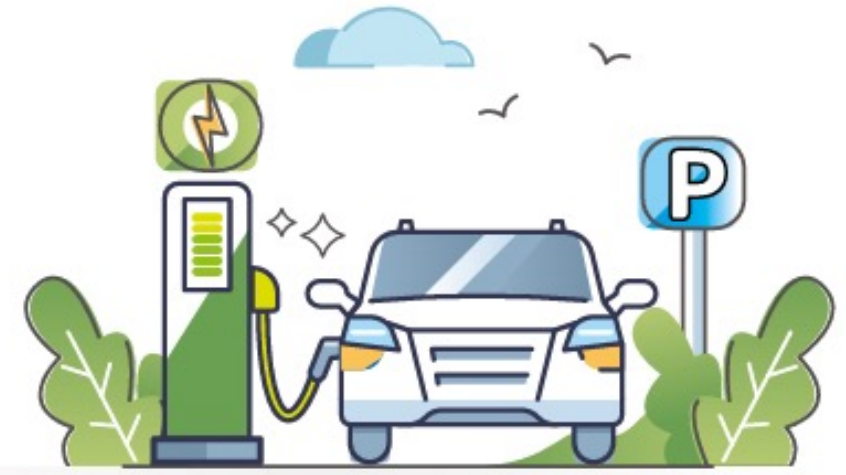
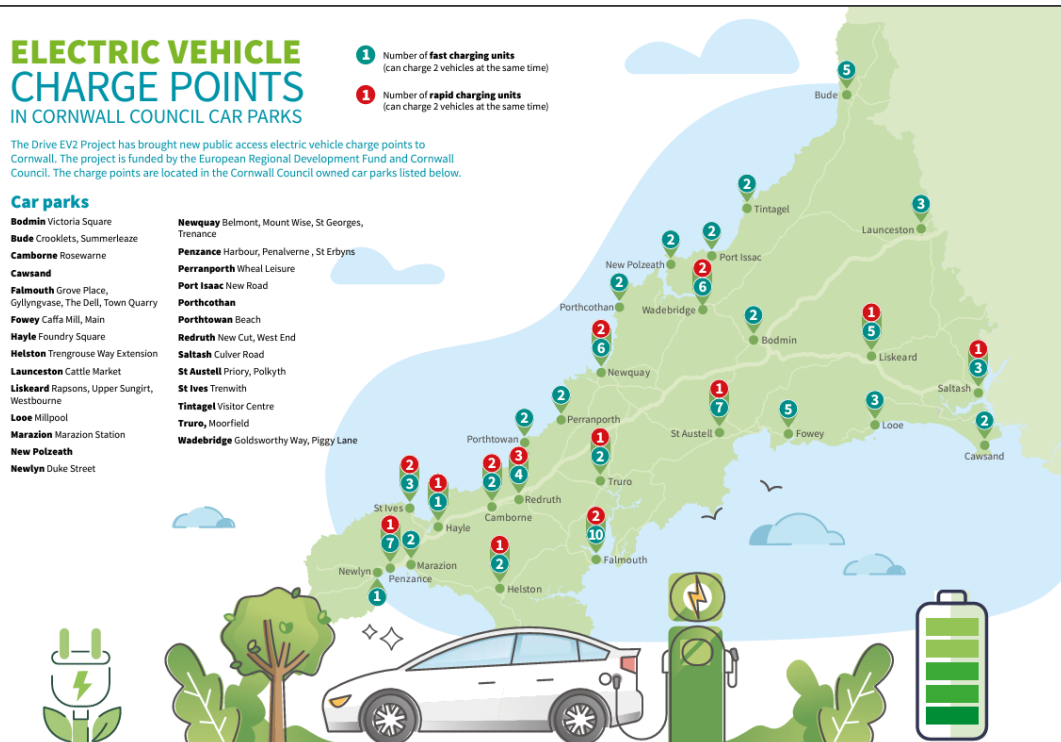
Legislative – The UK’s net zero target by 2050 is legally binding, and the Zero Emission Vehicle Mandate came into force in January 2024. It mandates the end of the sale of new petrol and diesel cars and vans from 2035.



Economic – Local benefits include job creation and upskilling opportunities, such as for vehicle technicians. Chargepoints can help attract visitors to destinations.

EV Infrastructure

Cornwall Council's [DriveEV2 Project](#) has installed 226 new, public EV charge points. Our operator SWARCO has also taken over our legacy charge points across the county and is in the process of replacing the older units.

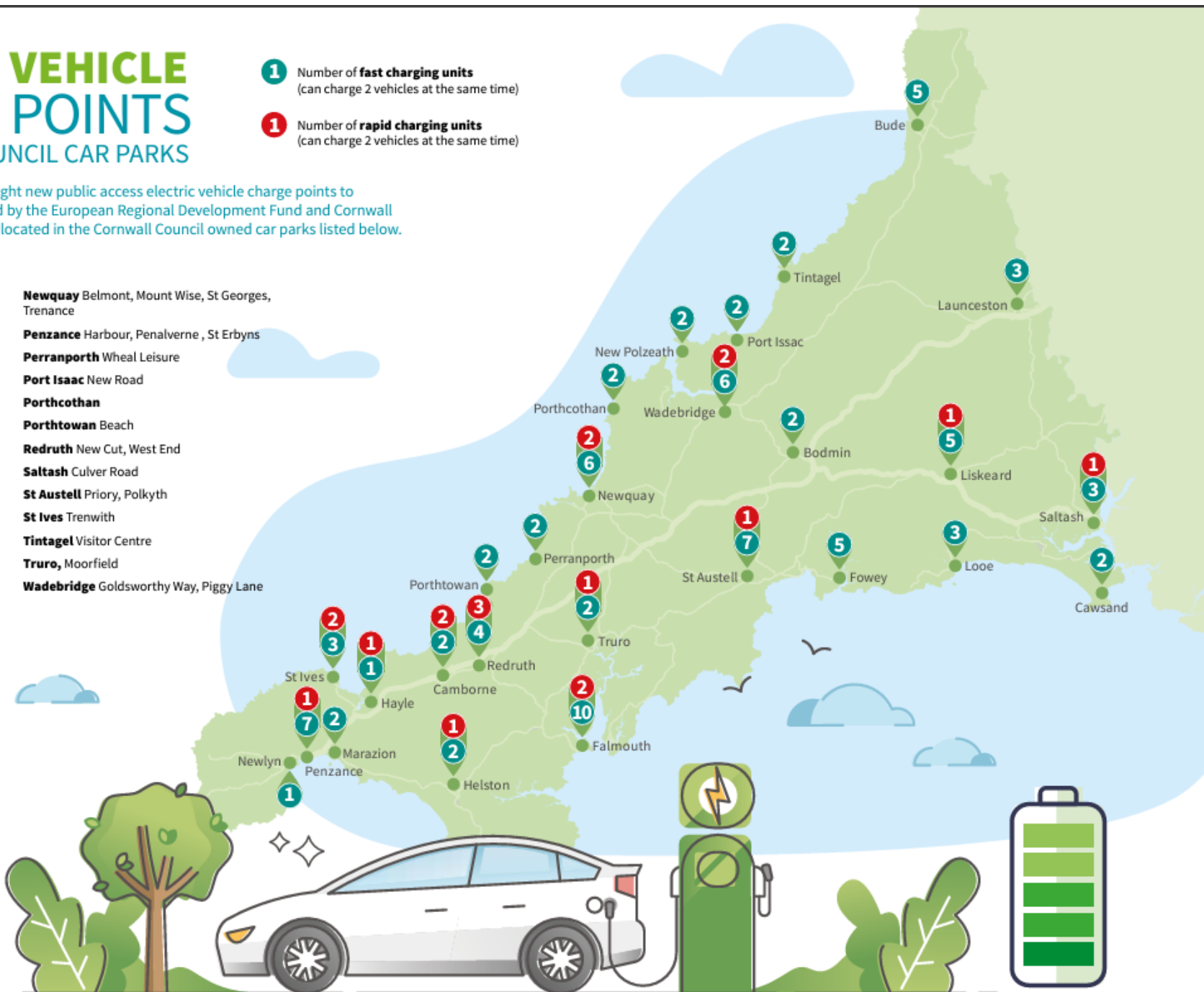

EV Infrastructure Strategy




The council is currently applying to Central Government for further £5.5m Local Electric Vehicle funding to install a new round of charge points.

Preference would always be to charge off-street or using a dedicated charging point. Details of all electric vehicle charging points in Cornwall is at [Zap-Map \(UK\)](#). As the Highway Authority, Cornwall Council handles safety for all road users. We will not give permission for installation of private units on the Highway due to the various legal restrictions.

Cornwall Council has approved the installation of Kerbocharge channels for charging electric vehicles. You will need a licence from Cornwall Council to install the EV channel.

What you need to do
