Annual General Meeting Memorial Hall

The public Memorial Hall AGM heard that 2005 had been a successful year. The ongoing programme of improvements and preventative maintenance continued and the only way to pay for and to keep pace with ever increasing running costs was by fund-raising and increased hire charges. The healthy annual accounts clearly identified this need and the prudence of these policies. A copy of the accounts is available for public scrutiny at the hall. The Management Committee for the coming year was established by the confirmation of the names of the representatives for the twelve member organisations and by the election and co-option of a further ten people, although one place remained vacant. Immediately following this the AGM of The Management Committee took place; the main business of which was the election of officers for the coming year. CARGREEN YACHT CLUB

During the winter the Yacht Club had the builders in. Since the clubhouse was built, the membership has grown in number; there are now more dinghy sailors, more female members who are active sailors and a much larger Cadet section. The club had simply outgrown the original changing rooms. A much-needed extension was built to increase the size of the changing and showers area, particularly for the women members.

Improvement was needed to the fireproofing and escape routes from the upper floor, which involved rerouting and enclosing the staircase and extending the entrance lobby.

It is hoped to be back in the clubhouse by the time you read this and well before the start of the next sailing season.

During the closure, there was a slightly reduced series of winter talks and social activities in the Crooked Spaniards.

This summer, with the larger clubhouse, there should be room for more dinghy sailing members and Cadets. If you are interested in joining, but have no sailing experience, we hope to run an adults beginners' dinghy sailing course on May21st/22nd. Cadet members (aged 10 to 16, open to all, parents don't have to be members) get a particularly good deal, with supervised sailing every Friday evening in summer with boats provided for them to sail.
