

Community First Responders

The impetus surrounding the recent Parish Plan led to an application to the West Country Ambulance Trust to set up a First Responder scheme in Landulph.

This scheme is made up of volunteers within our community who have been trained to attend designated emergency (999) calls received by the NHS Ambulance Service, providing first aid until an emergency ambulance arrives.

Many of these schemes are in operation in communities and workplaces around the world and have their basis in work done in the USA. This found that if a set sequence of events took place **before** hospital admission a cardiac arrest victim had a greater chance of survival.

These events are:

Early Access (to activate the emergency services)
Early Basic Life Support (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation)
Early Defibrillation (an electric shock to start the heart)
Early Advanced Care (paramedic intervention)

This sequence of events has become known as the "Chain of Survival".

Our Community Responders are trained in the first three stages of the chain.

Following initial training and assessment, each group member had to do a minimum of three shifts with an ambulance crew. Regular training and assessment has to be undertaken on a monthly basis, including further spells with ambulance crews. The group became active during the first half of last year and has attended several emergencies already.

Landulph Footpath Group

For the past few years the parish has been without a Footpaths Officer. Although renewed requests at the time of the Parish Plan Survey failed to attract a volunteer, a few concerned footpath users suggested they might share the task. The Landulph Footpath Group was subsequently formed, its aim being to assist the Parish Council with the management of the parish foot paths.

Under Cornwall County Council's local maintenance project, the Parish Council is responsible for organising and contracting out maintenance work, for which it has been reimbursed by CCC. This is about to change under a new paths priority strategy whereby paths are categorised as Gold , Silver or Bronze, with only "Gold" paths likely to be eligible for the full maintenance grant. CCC say that at present details of the scheme are not fully finalised.

During December a number of path improvements were carried out by local contractors using materials supplied by CCC. Thanks go to local CCC ranger Brian Lightfoot for help and support. While footpath group members try to check out the state of the footpaths regularly, information on problems encountered is welcomed—preferably in writing, to Reg Rice, Medano, Church Lane.

On December 27th the footpath group led 3 walks around the parish that attracted a large numbers of walkers.

The walks varied in length from 3 to 7.5 miles. Most of the parish footpaths were walked in a cold north wind but with beautiful sunshine. The walks ended at the Spaniards Inn where many had a welcome drink and lunch.

Landulph Festival Association

The Association stages the annual Landulph Festival of Music and Arts with performances of Classical Music, Jazz, Folk, Poetry and an Art Exhibition.

The origin of the Association lies in a music festival, which was first held in 2002 as part of a project to fund repairs to the roof of the Parish Church and was successfully completed in 2004. Such was the popularity of the festival, and the enthusiasm of the organising group, that it was decided to keep it going.

Consequently at a public meeting on 2nd December 2004 the Landulph Festival Association was formally constituted and in 2005 produced its first independent festival, which was a cultural and financial success.

Plans for this year's festival in June are well in hand and programme details will appear in the next issue of this newsletter. The Association's Constitution automatically confers free membership on all people over the age of 18 who live in the Parish of Landulph and neighbouring parishes.

Additionally, our aim is to care for, educate and enhance the individual development of the children within our local community in a safe, secure and stimulating environment. We have a wide range of toys and play equipment and undertake a broad range of activities with the children including craft making, cooking, painting, singing and story telling. Run by our fully qualified Playgroup Leaders, the Playgroup is OFSTED inspected, is a member of the Pre-School Learning Alliance and Early Years Development and Childcare Partnership (EYDCP). It follows the Cornwall EYDCP's Early Years Curriculum to aid the preparation of children for school, and works very closely with Landulph School. The Playgroup is qualified to receive funding for all 3 and 4 year olds.

The Playgroup is open:

Monday & Thursday 9.30am to 3.00pm Tuesday 9.30am to 12 noon

Children can attend the a.m. and/or p.m. session with a supervised lunchtime, provided they can bring a packed lunch. Children are welcome from 36 months. Part time school starters are also welcome.

Additionally, there is a thriving Baby and Toddler group which meets on a Thursday morning from 9.45am in the Memorial Hall Annexe. This provides an opportunity for new Mums to meet up and for the children to play.


