Parish Council Meeting 15 June 2009

Four councillors and four members of the public attended this 40 minute meeting. Was this a record for brevity?

Chairman Andrew Butcher noted the resignation of Olive Eggleston from parish council in view of the demands of her new role as a county councillor. Nominations for a replacement will be sought shortly.

Other agenda items covered old ground and were disposed of briskly.

Planning:

Council recommended refusal for: Listed Building Consent for conversion of redundant barn into two dwellings, and construction of two

detached garages, and installation of septic tank, North Wayton, Landulph. Strutt & Parker, for Pentille estate.

(This was the second part of the application for this project, council having recommended refusal of the FULL application at its last meeting. On this occasion council was uncertain whether to consider only those factors appertaining to the structure and aesthetics of a listed building, or the total impact. After detailed discussion, council decided to repeat all the objections raised last month.)

Andrew is a retired dental practitioner and has lived in the parish for 37 years, initially in "Tamar", next to the phone box, before building his own home at the top end of Fore Street. For many years he has been actively involved in local organisations, including the British Dental Association, the Round Table, and Cargreen Yacht Club, and more recently as a First Responder, and committee member of Liskeard and District Fine Arts Society. Both he and his wife Jo are lively supporters of parish clubs and events, leaving Andrew some time for sailing too.

He joined the Parish Council in 2008, and was elected Chairman in May 2009. He clearly has a great affection for our local environment and community, and looks forward to contributing to their care as a councillor. As Chairman, his focus is on absorbing the recent local government changes (abolition of Cornish district Councils), and encouraging parishioners to connect more closely with their Parish Council. With that in mind, he may initiate a limited rescrutiny of the Parish Plan so that local needs and views are fully taken on board.

Gerry is another councillor who arrived in the parish comparatively recently yet he is deeply concerned that the Cornish residents are not better represented. A former human resources director with Thompson Newspapers, he is a member of the Institute of Directors and continues to work part time as an advisor.

Recently appointed Council Vice-Chairman he is its representative on the Saltash Road Safety Committee and responsible for School Liason. He takes a deep interest in planning and is concerned that the new Cornwall Council has delegated too much power to council officers without the right of appeal to the elected Planning Committee. He also worries that small parishes are being sidelined. Landulph, he said, 'Has a tiny budget and few assets but we need to support our local organisations, particularly our very good school, which is important for the health of the parish.'

Council to address the need to formulate a view, and I leave it to you to work out how this led to discussion of plating the Hall roof with photovoltaic panels and selling electricity to the national grid.

Your Council needs your help... nearly two years ago it made a commitment to erect a slate plaque inscribed 'The Searle Family Memorial Field' as requested by the gentleman who donated the (cricket) field to the Council. Unfortunately the Council did not budget for purchase and inscription cost, and so far has been unable to find a free slab. So **please contact Andrew Butcher** if you can provide one.

Gaye mentioned that her attention (as footpaths representative) had been drawn to **garden waste** that appeared to have been tipped on to the beach between the pub and the yacht club. An interesting discussion followed, for it was not clear whose property had received the fly-tipping nor who had tipped it on the fly, (and therefore to whom Council should make representations), but in the interests of good citizenship it was decided that all resident in the affected area should be made aware of the problem by letter.

Gerry is our representative on the Saltash Road Safety Committee, and would welcome reports on **dangerous road conditions** either to him or to Saltash Town Council

clerk at the Guildhall. Despite recent tar-and-chip treatments, potholes and dips continue to annoy, and Council will continue to press for repairs.

Having had no volunteers for the vacant post of parish councillor, Council decided to extend the period for applications until 21st September. This will be the date of the next meeting, unless planning applications oblige an August meeting.

At the September meeting, Council will open discussion on a revised Parish Plan, and urges as many parishioners as possible to attend, as the Plan will reflect their needs and hopes for future development in the parish. It will be a powerful reference point when higher levels of local government make decisions affecting Landulph.

Change of use of agricultural land to amenity and equine use/livery. Mrs R Reep, Lower Stockadon, St Mellion.

Construction of porch. Mr J Hall, Landulph Rise, Landulph.

Meeting lasted 88 minutes. County Councillor Eggleston, Mr Swales and 6 members of the public attended.
