## Parish Council Meeting 16 June 2008

Before the meeting, the chairman paid tribute to the public service of **retiring councillors Mavis Edmonds and Ray Oatham**, and presented Mavis with a frothily variegated potted Acer in a pink-ribboned pot; Ray was not present, but would not have been embarrassed with his plain-leaved Acer or its blue ribbons.

The depleted council moved briskly through a fairly routine agenda, but you may be interested to know that the inshore end of the repaired Spaniards Inn slipway will reinstate the previous route of the public footpath, and that only approved council minutes will be posted on notice boards and the parish website.

**Planning.** Council recommended approval for:

Revision of drive entrance, Meadow Lodge, Coombe Lane, Cargreen. Mr P Braund

## Parish Council Meeting 21 July 2008

In the absence of the chairman, Gerry Stevenson was elected to chair this meeting, and to be Vice Chairman for the year. Andrew Butcher was unanimously voted onto the Council, as the sole **volunteer for co-option** following the two recent resignations. District Councillor Mrs Garner summarised recent progress towards the Unitary Authority. Council considered an invitation from Matthew Taylor MP to support his petition for an independent review of the plan to establish a giant incinerator at St Dennis for processing of Cornwall's combustible waste. The review was

supported, and reservations were expressed about the suitability of the project. Council also agreed to write in support of **retention of the parish's mobile Post Office service**.

The insurers of the **playground equipment** at Penyoke have listed various necessary repairs and maintenance, and Council hopes that some of these tasks will be undertaken by local volunteers – please contact Gerry on 01752 842889.

Correspondence included offers of **grants for worthy local project**, including a farewell grant from Caradon District Council which has £540K to give away – see its website. (No, Alastair, darling, not for you). SITA waste management offers grants for physical improvements to community, sporting or historic projects – see [www.sitatrust.org.uk](http://www.sitatrust.org.uk). **Youth activities** may get support from [www.omyd.org.uk](http://www.omyd.org.uk).

**Planning.** Council offered no recommendation for:

Alteration and extension to existing dwelling and formation of new drive, Grove Villa, Landulph, Mr G Easson, because of inadequate information about existing footpath.

Council recommended refusal for:

Dining room extension, relocation of existing balcony and extension of decking, 17 Hodders Way, Cargreen, Mr B Ford.

6 members of the public and District Councillor Mrs Garner attended.

Each branch has a number of activity groups, generally consisting of 10-15 members. These groups provide educational, creative and leisure opportunities in a friendly environment. ## Long term parish Residents

### Tony Channings

Tony was born in St Barnabas Hospital; his Mother was from Cargreen and Father from Saltash where he was a projectionist in the old Regal Cinema. In those days, Father also helped with electrical work, sometimes rewiring houses, one of which was to later become the family home in the village. Tony and the family lived in Tavy View, Fore St, later moving to Two Rivers. He recalls how there was no electricity in his early years, lamps being the order of the day, and a radio which was powered by huge batteries brought in from Callington. At the age of 9, he joined a "select" group of village youngsters who over the years nearly lost their lives by falling into the Tamar. Fortunately one of the many American servicemen in the village, sitting in the Royal Oak as the Spaniards was known, spotted the lad just about to go under for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time, and Tony was plucked from the river by Len Brooking. He sat on the quayside for a while, and then walked home!

His Grandfather was a fisherman, often helped by his father, supplying salmon to Billingsgate market, and Tony tells me that there were many more fish than there are now.

Tony has vivid memories of the war years, and recalls a German plane in flames being pursued by the RAF and anti aircraft fire from Carkeel, finally



coming down on the Devon side. Many tales such as collecting buckets of shrapnel which had landed in Fore St, huge numbers of service personnel and boats, and memories of gas mask exercises in the school lead me to believe that there is scope for a book!

Following the building of the houses in Church lane, numbers 1 to 4 being originally for those returning from the war, Tony's family took up residence in number 7, where they would stay for some 30 years. His last move was around 1993 when his present home was built.

On leaving school, Tony worked until he was 20 at Landulph Farm, owned then by Kellock Roberts. He briefly worked at Bush Radio, and then for 9 years with Jack Cloake in greenhouses behind Tredean in Fore St, before deciding that indoor work wasn't for him, and applying for a job with the water board. He was to stay with them for 32 years, before retiring in 1997.

A very good Table Tennis player, Tony was in several league teams, and has numerous cups and awards for his sport. He was also a keen cricketer, playing in Cornwall leagues, and a member of the successful Landulph Cricket Club when the Cricket field was purchased for the Parish.




