## Parish Council Summer 2010

There are usually no meetings of Landulph Parish Council during August, the exception being if there is an important planning application to consider. Other than a slight modification to an already approved plan there were no applications.

However since the formation of the Cornwall Council as a unitary authority there have been some changes.

Landulph is part of the St Germans Cluster of Parishes and we form part of the Cornwall Gateway Community Network Area (CNA). This includes the other Parish Council Cluster of the Rame Peninsular and the towns of Saltash and Torpoint.

Our small Parish has few of the issues that beset the Towns but has many similarities with our neighbouring Parishes. There is a new inclusiveness shown by the Towns towards the Parishes such that we are attending regular operational and consultative meetings as the CNA dealing so far with Roads, Housing and Town Plans.

There is a general view that Cornwall Council is Truro and West Cornwall centred and that in the East we have to fight hard for recognition that we exist let alone gain funding.

We are regarded as part of the 'Plymouth Travel to Work Area' and we were told at a recent meeting that Cornwall Council regularly meets with Plymouth Council regarding development in East Cornwall. There

has been no consultation with Councils in East Cornwall about this!

One new development that has united all of our local councils is the threat of being included in a Plymouth parliamentary constituency. This has not been welcomed. Monies seem to be allocated by central government to constituency areas. Given the struggle to be acknowledged by our own current 'County' Council we would certainly be at the end of the funding chain if involved with any part of the City of Plymouth.

Meanwhile here in Landulph the use of the Telephone Box grows, the hedges have been cut, the traffic speeds up and there has been a serious accident in the lanes, the Cricket Teams have had a good season.


There is much discussion taking place about the practicality of cooking the perfect roast potato in the Memorial Hall ovens. However we all like a challenge!

## Ksenija Sidorova



Those of you who came to the superb opening to last year's Festival, the guitar concert by the amazing Morgan

Szymanski, will be excited to hear that we will be opening with another concert of the same calibre, given by the classical accordionist, **Ksenija Sidorova**. She will be playing a programme which will include works by Scarlatti, Bach and Grief on **Saturday 02 Oct 7.30pm**.

Born in Latvia in 1988, Ksenija started playing accordion in her home town of Riga. Since 2005 she has been studying as an undergraduate at the Royal Academy of Music in London, with Professor Owen Murray. In July 2009 Ksenija obtained a BMus Diploma receiving the Lady Theodore Holland Prize for the 2nd Highest BMus Graduate and the Council of Honour Prize for a highly original contribution to the development and evolution of music. Ksenija is a winner of international competitions in Latvia, Lithuania, Russia and Italy.

Recent engagements include a performance with the Latvian National Symphony Orchestra, a recital in Colston Hall (Bristol), performances in Spitalfields Festival and DMCE symposium (Dramaturgie Musicale Contemporaine en Europe, Paris,

France) and a performance of Prokofiev's Cantata for the 20th Anniversary of the October Revolution Op 74 with Orchestra of the Mariinsky Theatre and CBSO under Valery Gergiev. In February 2009 Ksenija was a joint winner of the "Friends of the Royal Academy of Music Wigmore Award", which led to her Wigmore Hall debut on May 18, 2009.

She has also won the Worshipful Company of Musicians Maisie Lewis Award and Prince's Prize, Philharmonia Orchestra Martin Musical Scholarship Fund Award and Philharmonia Orchestra Friends Award. She is also a recipient of the Silver Medal of the Worshipful Company of Musicians.

Both Morgan Szymanski and **Ksenija Sidorova** are sponsored by YCAT: the Young Concert Artists Trust which identifies, nurtures and promotes outstanding young classical soloists and chamber ensembles trained in the UK.

**Rumpus Country Dance/Ceilidh Band** are a South Devon-based country dance band. They play traditional and contemporary music from the British Isles and beyond, on melodeon, fiddle (acoustic & electric), concertina and guitar. The band includes an experienced caller to teach the dances.

## **Nicholas Collier**

Nicholas Collier was born in 1947 and trained at Exeter College of Art, where having met Hepworth, Nicholson and Heron he was much influenced by the St Ives School in the late 60s. After teaching posts in London and Dorset, and latterly as Director of Art at Kelly College, he now lives and paints in West Devon. Nick has exhibited in the RA Summer Exhibition, the Royal West of England Academy, the Academy South West Exeter, the Plymouth

Society of Artists, Dorchester County Museum, Poole Arts Centre, the New Gallery Windsor, and Art Connoisseur, Marylebone. The paintings are developed in series in the studio and worked from rapid drawings made in the landscape. The works in turn then fully exploit the expressionist possibilities of surface and pigment.

Hannah Silva is a writer, performer and theatre maker whose distinctive style combines the physicality of theatre with fast-paced poetry and vocal gymnastics. ## Landulph Film Club

As part of Landulph Festival, on **Thursday 14 Oct 7.30pm** Landulph Film Club presents *La Vie en Rose*. Literally *Life in Pink*;



released in France as *La Môme*, referring to Piaf's nickname "La Môme Piaf," meaning "The Little Sparrow") is a 2007 French-Czech-British biographical film about the life of French chanteuse Édith Piaf co-written and directed by Olivier Dahan. Marion Cotillard stars as Piaf. The title *La Vie en Rose* comes from Piaf's signature song. The film won five Césars, including one for Best Actress, and Cotillard won an Academy Award for her performance, marking the first time an Oscar had been given for a French-language role. She is also the first French actress to win a Comedy or Musical Golden Globe for a foreign language role. It also became the first French film to win more than one Oscar; the other being for Makeup.
