Your guide to what's happening in the area

Landulph Parish Council

March 2013

The importance of the new National Planning Policy Framework was highlighted by Vice-Chairman Gerry Stevenson speaking at the March Parish Council Meeting. He said the parish should consider what sort of development it might accept in the area. He explained that if a Parish working group produced proposals that were accepted locally in a referendum, there would be a presumption that these would go ahead if a developer wanted to build in the parish.

In other business, the council was told that agreement had been reached on an improved entrance to the cricket field and work would begin shortly. Equipment at the playing field is now being checked monthly by the council members in addition to the annual professional inspection. Quotes for improving the football pitch have been accepted and this work will also start shortly.

The date of the Parish Council elections was announced as 2 May and Candidate Packs were handed out to all councillors wishing to be nominated for re-election. County Council elections will be held on the same day.

In the planning meeting approval was given to a tarmac road at the entrance to Valley View Farm (now already built) and to the erection of three osprey poles on the Pentille estate.

The next Council meeting will be on 15 April and will be the last for the

New regime for the Parish Council

Landulph moved out of the Butcher years and into the age of Stevenson on Monday 20 May. The old Parish Council, chaired by Andrew Butcher closed for business after the Annual Parish Assembly and the new one took over during the following May monthly meeting. The councillors had all been returned unopposed except for Andrew Butcher who retired to spend more time in New Zealand. Gerry Stevenson was elected to fill his shoes. Andrew's retirement left a vacancy on the Council and, remarkably, there were two nominations for co-option.

In a ballot Euan 'Mac' Armstrong was elected. Gerry Stevenson paid tribute to Andrew's work for the Council and Parish over many years and wished him well in the future.

There were many overlaps in the business of the April and May meetings and the Annual Assembly so these notes will deal with them all together.

The prospect of some form of affordable housing development in the parish is becoming more likely. In November the Council heard of a proposal to build on the Barratt field behind Coombe Drive. At the May

meeting they heard preliminary details of plans by Cavanna Homes to build an unspecified number of houses on land at Rosehill Nurseries. It is unlikely that any concrete proposals will appear until the autumn, Cornwall Council Affordable Housing Team Leader, Andrew O'Brien said the County wanted to build 1,000 affordable homes a year. The need for such housing in Landulph was not clear though. Seven people are on the Home Choice Register but a recent Housing Needs survey indicated 17 households with a housing need. All or none of these may actually require housing in the parish. With Cornwall demanding 50 percent subsidised housing in all developments, to provide say 10 such units, a developer would have to erect 20 dwellings. Gerry Stevenson said the building pressure meant it was vital the Parish drew up a Neighbourhood Plan so that it could retain control of development and direct any housing to the sites parishioners considered most suitable.

In Andrew Butcher's final annual report the regular topics of potholes, grit bins and broadband featured. Andrew said he was so keen to see a Parish Council website established he was prepared to make a personal contribution. One of the things the site could do, he said, was display standing orders and councillor's duties and responsibilities which would help explain things such as the voting for

the Crooked Spaniard development.

In other business the Council was delighted to report it had moved the goalposts – the recreation ground goalposts, that is, and reseeding had taken place. More pot holes were reported.

Gardening Club members may be delighted to hear that there are plans to put up a barrier on the corner at the foot of Ziggarson Hill, where several members famously ended up in a coach suspended over the bank.

The Parish had a slight surplus at the end of the financial year which, added to existing reserves brings these close to the permitted upper limit.

No crime has been recorded in the Parish.

The new Cornwall Councillor for our ward, Daniel Pugh, attended the meeting.


