Your guide to what's happening in the area

Landulph Parish Council

Following the recent council elections, at the annual meeting of the parish council in May, I was elected as chairman, and I am delighted to say that Mac Armstrong was co-opted as a councillor, bringing the council up to full strength. Best wishes were offered to Andrew Butcher, the outgoing chairman who had valiantly steered the council through the preparation and adoption of the Parish Plan in 2010, and some difficult planning decisions. We shall miss his enthusiasm and leadership.

We were also able to welcome our new Cornwall Councillor, Daniel Pugh, to the meeting.

We can consider the meetings in June and July together, as the important items for discussion remained the same. Following Andrew's earlier initiative, the council had a presentation on the development of a dedicated parish website, and agreed to go ahead using the services of WesternWeb Computer Services who have installed similar town and parish websites elsewhere in Cornwall.

In the meantime, the council is pressing ahead with the preparation of formal standing orders which will govern the way in which its business is conducted in the future.

Parishioners will no doubt have noticed the fine wall built at the entrance to the cricket field, and thanks are due to Jim Clouting who so generously contributed to its construction costs.

At the recent meeting of the Saltash Area Road Safety Committee, it was stated that the solid white lines from Homeleigh Cottages should have been double all the way to the Stockadon turn-off, and the Committee is continuing to press for the work to be properly completed. Cornwall Council is also expected to construct a barrier at the bottom of Ziggarson Hill to prevent any recurrence of the accident last year when a bus carrying members of the Gardening Club ended up overhanging the stream.

We are continuing to press Cornwall Council for more and better pothole repairs, but the message coming back is that they are doing the minimum possible in efforts to reduce their costs.

The goal posts in the playing field at Penyoke have been resited and the damaged areas have been repaired and reseeded. The pathway between the hedge and the fenced children's playground has been cleared, and further maintenance of the equipment is under consideration. Thanks are due to those councillors who have voluntarily given their time and effort to effect repairs and maintenance. Any parishioner who notices matters for improvement should let me know. and volunteers to carry out any improvement works will be welcome. Gerry Stevenson Chairman, Landulph Parish Council






