Parish Council Meeting, November

Council freezes precept for second year At its November meeting the Landulph Parish Council agreed to hold the parish precept for 2014/2015 at £9,100 for a second year. However, this figure includes the Council Tax Support grant which could be withdrawn by the Government before the new financial year.

The Crooked Spaniards Inn Following hard work and a recent application by SPECSSCA, the Council heard that the Crooked Spaniards Inn has been accepted as an Asset of Community Value. This means that for a period of six months after notification of an intention to sell by the owners, the community has an opportunity to register intent to make a bid for the pub and raise the necessary funds. However, it should be noted that this does not give the community any right to buy.

Parish Website The Council will be teaming up with WesternWeb to develop an official Parish website maintained by the Parish Clerk. WesternWeb has already created a number of local government websites in the area. Our past chairman, Andrew Butcher who initiated the idea, has agreed to work with the Council and WesternWeb on creating the website.

Included on the site will be a copy of the new Standing Orders so members of the public can see the rules by which the Council conducts its affairs.

Have Your Say In July this year, the developers of the Broadmoor Farm site announced their plans during a consultation process held in Saltash. This is in line with Cornwall's Local Plan.

The developers are coming to the Landulph Memorial Hall at 7pm before the Council meeting on 16 December to explain the plans, and get feedback from the public, prior to another major consultation exercise in Saltash in January. The Council has already joined with other local rural parishes in expressing concerns about plans for another roundabout at Carkeel and the road access off the A38 at Stoketon Cross.

Members of the public are invited to come to the meeting and express their views to the developers.

Neighbourhood Planning The Council agreed to explore the implications of developing a neighbourhood plan. It is known that Cornwall Council will abolish the current development boundaries in their forthcoming Local Plan. Neighbourhood planning will enable the community to have a say in what sort of development they want in the parish, and where.

Next Generation You will recall reading in the newsletter over the past year details of this project. It is the conversion of the old snooker room and store to provide a small usable facility for the community, in particular to provide a well-insulated, safe and modern room and kitchen for use by the Under 5's. Seventy-five per cent of the funding is in place and Jason Reep of Orchard Property Solutions will start work at the beginning of January.

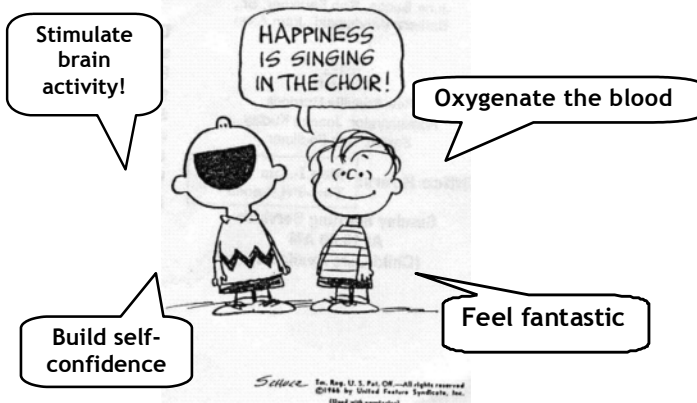

The *Kate* or not the *Kate*

In the *Landulph, a Parish at War* booklet the Newsletter group published recently, we included the photograph below supplied by Nigel Cummings which is quite well known locally. It shows a topsail trading schooner unloading coal at Hosking's quay with the Royal Oak (Crooked Spaniards) and various storerooms in the background. The photo has always been captioned as 'probably' the *Kate*. Some confirmation that it really is the *Kate* has been provided by David and Janet Whiteside who were staying in the village recently at Slipway Quay. They subsequently found the painting also shown here, which is archived on line at the BBC 'Your Paintings' site; the somewhat damaged original is held by the North Devon Maritime museum. The painting is signed T.S. and titled *The Topsail Schooner 'Kate'*. The pictures undoubtedly show ships of the same general type (trading topsail schooners) and there is nothing here to disprove the *Kate* theory. Are they one and the same? Can anyone tell us?

It was sad that they couldn't share in this year's success. They will both be sadly missed. We look forward to next season and whatever the new Divisions bring. 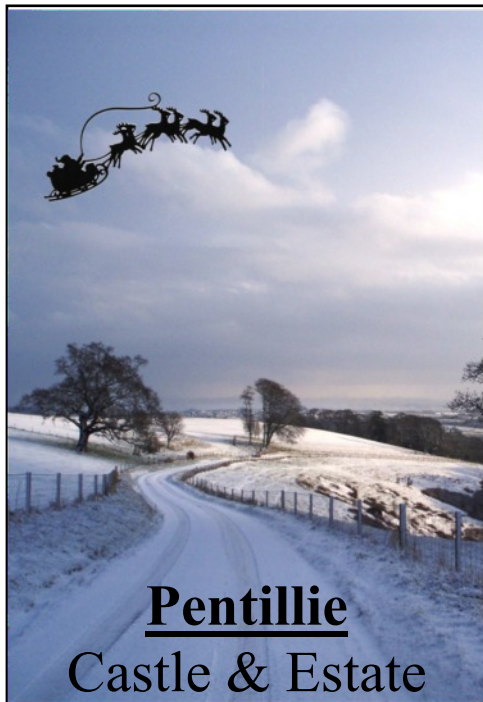
