Your guide to what's happening in the area

Landulph Parish Council

Meeting on 15 October 2012

On a miserable wet day, many parishioners felt that the delights of a learned presentation on “Turner in the Tamar” at the Yacht Club would be more fun than the Parish council meeting. In the event, a total of three members of the public attended, narrowly outnumbered by four councillors.

The big news was the forthcoming co-option of two new councillors who will be appearing at the November meeting. The first to step forward was Reg Rice who has served the Council over a number of years in earlier times. The other candidate was a relative newcomer to the parish, Sharon Eccles from Grove Villa.

The main agenda was short, with some discussion arising out of the minutes of the previous meeting and AOB. A check of the remaining crab apple tree at Penyoke was found to have revealed no problems. The planned improvements to the children’s play area and main playing field are still ongoing. It was noted that grants had been received for the Memorial Hall which would allow for the fitment of a long-overdue dishwasher. Committee members, and other volunteers rejoice!

It was noted that the area at the entrance to the cricket field by the Searle Family Memorial Field plaque was very tatty, and a disgrace to the community. It needed tidying, and it was agreed in principle to explore the idea of building a small stone wall (as in front of the Memorial hall). One quote had been received, and further quotes for the work were to be sought.

There was no formal planning agenda, but it was noted that a

proposed solar farm development at North Wayton Farm had appeared on the Cornwall Council website. The company concerned had held a public consultation meeting at the Memorial Hall on 11 September and it is expected that a planning application will be on the agenda for the November meeting.

Editorial note: The solar farm was discussed at a special meeting of the Parish Council on 29 October when councillors voted unanimously in favour of the project (David Peck declared an interest and did not vote). A representative of developers, Kronos Solar Projects, a German company, explained that they would erect a 5Mw array with a 25 year lease (the likely lifespan of the farm). During a public forum session questions had been raised about a nearby footpath, access, the loss of agricultural land and the threat to nearby trees. The Council were satisfied by assurances on all these matters from the company, which acting Chairman Gerry Stevenson described as having been ‘totally consistent’ in their promises to keep the impact of the farm to a minimum.

Meeting on 19 November 2012

Attending their first meeting as newly co-opted councillors were Reg Rice and Sharon Eccles. The main item on the agenda was to set the precept for 2013/2014. Extra costs during the year arising from council elections in 2013 and other matters were noted but an increase in the precept was held to £100 i.e. a total of £9100.

An amended draft Code of Conduct was adopted including two changes: councillors cannot accept any gifts or hospitality offered in connection with their official duties; the Council delegated to the Parish Clerk the authority to grant dispensations under specific circumstances allowing councillors who might otherwise be prohibited because of their particular interests to take part in council business.

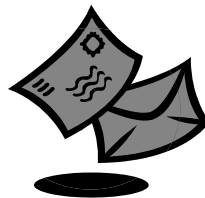
Council accepted, with appreciation, an offer by Jim Clouting to help defray the costs of tidying up the entrance to the Searle Family Memorial Field. Quotes were being requested, with the work expected to be completed next spring.

During the public forum Council agreed to support a project planned for the old snooker room to improve facilities for the pre-school group. It was noted that the Cornwall Local Plan is proposing between 38000 and 48000 new homes over the next 20 years, with our Community Network Area taking about 500. The Plan will be put out for further consultation at the beginning of the year.

Other items discussed concerned the Memorial Clock and ensuring that the salt bins were prepared for the winter snows.

Following the main meeting, Council approved Certificate of Lawfulness for the continuation of the erection of an agricultural dwelling at Penhaye.

It was noted that the Solar Farm development at North Wayton Farm was now in a queue waiting to be considered by Cornwall Strategic Planning Committee. No date has been set for its hearing.



Letter to the Editor from the Rector of Landulph

Sir, Very soon the word "Christmas" will be coming at us fast and furiously from advertisers and others. 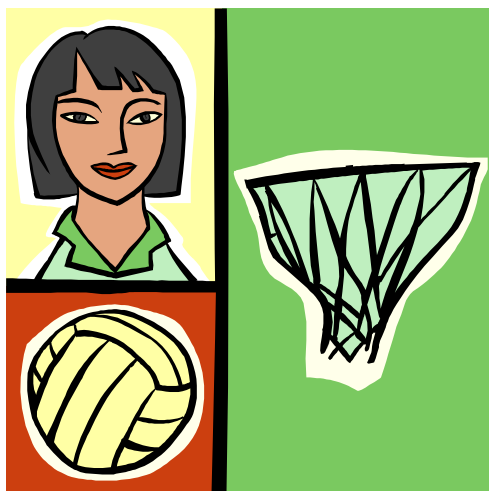

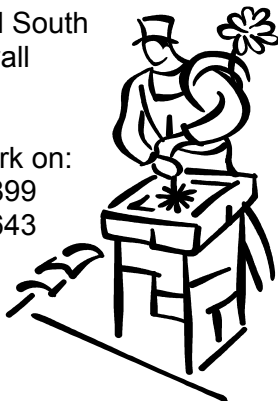

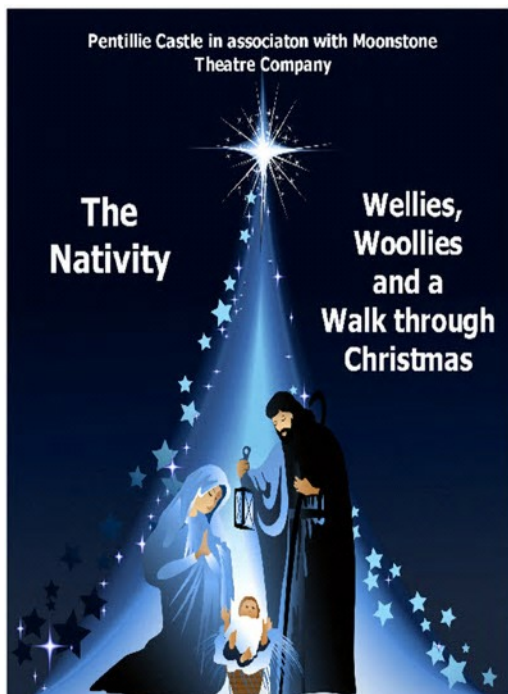

Cricket Club Vandalised

Escaped horses have trampled the Landulph cricket pitch used by Saltash Cricket Club. Such considerable damage has been caused to the playing surface that it may be impossible to restore it to its previous condition. The damage was caused on 16 or 17 October by more than one horse. The Club leases the ground from the Parish Council and spends in excess of £1,000 a year maintaining the playing surface. Members have been unable to identify the horse responsible or their owners. Local Police have been contacted with a view to identifying the offender. Any further damage to the pitch might force the club to withdraw from the cricket league altogether as the surface would be considered dangerous. We value local support and would appreciate the vigilance of villagers should they see any damage being caused to the field.
