#### **April Parish Council**

The proposed new lighting bar for the Memorial Hall was approved and progress is being made towards its installation. It will be funded by money from the Solar Park and the Festival Committee. The committee also approved a sum of £500 for buying new books for Landulph School. Following a successful village meeting about the Neighbourhood Plan (see elsewhere in this issue) 14 people had expressed an interest in joining a group to develop the plan. The group will be canvassing the opinion of parishioners on many subjects and holding regular public consultations, the Council heard.

#### Parish Council in May

The Parish Council held its Annual Assembly in May. Among items raised by Chairman Gerry Stevenson in his annual report was the lack of progress on the Broadmoor Farm development where little had happened except the installation of the pedestrian bridge across the A38. He also asked parishioners to report any near misses or dangerous incidents at the Sillaton junction with the A388 where the council has been campaigning for double white lines for three years without success. Reports should go to the Parish Clerk, Katherine Williams or our MP, Sheryll Murray. At the regular monthly meeting Gerry Stevenson was re-elected Chairman for another year with Mac Armstrong as Deputy Chairman.

For the first time in a long while the regular police report contained news of a crime in the parish. There had been a case of malicious damage at the Cargreen Yacht Club where a dinghy had been slashed.

It was business as usual though on our roads, a regular topic at meetings. The Council is to ask why the Ellbridge diversion is still in operation, months after the work was due to be completed. Parishioners have reported that the company doing the work has run out of money with a few yards of trench filling work to be completed. It was observed that the Parish seemed to be out of favour with the County compared to St Mellion which had received a £250,000 average speed camera system.

The council is to 'object strongly' to 'an abuse of the original application' to erect an agricultural dwelling on land at River View Farm. The owners of the farm, Mr and Mrs Williams have applied for a variation of the original conditions of approval. Chris Wyman said the application was a delaying tactic as the approval was nearly time-expired. He also expressed doubts about the need for an agricultural dwelling as the Williams had moved out of the area.

In contrast the Council voted to support an application to convert an integral garage to accommodation at Penyoke Barn.

The County is to be urged to monitor closely the felling of trees on a site between the Cargreen Yacht Club and the South West Water pumping station in Coombe Lane. Several trees have already been felled and it was feared the site might be cleared completely.

#### Hall back on track after EGM

The Landulph Memorial Hall has a fully functioning committee again after a number of volunteers came forward at an Emergency General Meeting in April. The Hall, which is owned by the Parish Council, must be run independently and the lack of a committee was threatening its future. The committee now has seven members and the following officers were elected:

Retiring Chairman Jo Butcher also told the meeting new tables had been bought for the hall replacing the old wooden trestle table.

At the close of the meeting, on behalf of the parish and all the organisations who used the Hall over many years, James Jermain expressed their thanks to Jo for her inspired and dedicated work on their behalf. Among her major achievements she had over-

seen the creation of the Under-5s 'school' room, the installation of the new acoustic ceiling and the lighting bar and the renovation of the interior throughout. Phillip Braund, who was retiring as Deputy Chairman, and who has been involved in the management of the hall for around 15 years, was also warmly thanked.










#### Another year another application

The Arnolds, owners of the Crooked Spaniards Inn presented their latest proposals for developing the site to a public meeting on 16 May. It seemed most of the Parish attended the open house presentation and many spoke at length to representatives of the newly appointed architects, BBH of Dartmouth, and their planning consultant. Contrary to rumours, Anton Piotrowski was not present and it is thought his connection with the project is now tenuous.



The new plans show seven housing units in the car park. They will be suitable for private occupation or holiday-lets. Adam Benns for the architects said they had tried to address the issues raised when the last application was rejected. The overall height of the development is certainly a little lower and the design is less 'docklands'. All seven units are now in the car park leaving the pub/restaurant as a larger and more viable unit. The houses are double banked at the far end of the car park. To increase parking the site will be dug out and spaces created under the pub and some of the housing. To achieve this without the site flooding the whole area will be 'tanked'.

Adam Benns said the proposals were still a 'work in progress' and he will be looking closely at comments and issues raised by parishioners before finalising the designs. He said he expected a formal application to be made to Cornwall Planners in about three months.

#### Neighbourhood Plan gets go-ahead

A well-attended meeting in the Memorial Hall in April heard about the importance of creating a Neighbourhood Plan if Landulph wanted to retain control over future development in the parish. Planning consultants told

the meeting the parish could not necessarily rely on the protection of such things as AONB (Area of Outstanding Beauty) status or the restrictions in the Cornwall Plan. A Neighbourhood Plan, once accepted by the Cornwall Council would be a powerful tool in preventing undesirable development while encouraging the sort of home building and job creation projects parishioners might want.

It was suggested the first step would be to create a steering group to establish whether a Plan was needed for Landulph and to look at the work of other parishes which had gone down this route. After the meeting 14 people volunteered to form a working party, which is expected to start work soon – watch this space.




