Parish Council 18 December

Interesting planning applications attracted an unusually generous public attendance, outnumbering the councillors, and had nothing to do with the seasonal drinks & nibbles at the end of the meeting. 'Pre-app' was a new bit of jargon freely bandied about, concerning the Spaniards Inn developers lodging of a pre-application notice with the County planning department. Our councillors felt they should have something to say about it, but the Council website's summary of proposals used exactly the same wording as the previously refused application. Understandably baffled, the Council agreed to point out the Neighbourhood Plan's constraints on housing numbers and waterfront development.

The extension of the 20mph traffic restriction to the bottom of Fore Street remains a live issue, not least because it would be unenforceable (resource constraints) and cost £1,000s for signage and administration. Chairman Martin Worth mentioned the possibility of volunteer vigilantes in high-vis jackets monitoring traffic with speed guns, and seemed unamused.

Penyoke playground equipment has recently been given a clean bill of health by an independent expert inspector, which is immensely satisfying after the embarrassments of its previous dilapidation.

Then, as sometimes happens, a dull item takes off in unexpected directions. A plan to list our Council's fixed assets raised the question 'does the Council own the Memorial Hall?' Opposing views were expressed, for example that it owned only the land and not the building, so we look forward to January's meeting when our anxieties might be resolved and we can join hands to dance across sunlit uplands with joy in our hearts. By then local landowners will have received from our Council a letter reminding them of their responsibilities regarding roadside hedge cutting, and pointing out penalties for non-compliance. Yes! Finally a personal note to encourage public attendance at our Council meetings. Chairman Martin Worth is trying to engage with parishioners by providing more interaction, information and involvement. Council meetings have new-found buoyancy and deserve more generous support. Apart from anything else, there's a lot of laughter.

Parish Council Meeting, January 2018

Unusually, an extended Public Forum was devoted to a presentation by Tim Bell, chairman of the Under 5s Group. It is threatened with closure by mid-February unless £1,250 can be found quickly in order to cover staff and running costs, and a further £250 in March to secure survival until Easter. The business plan is being addressed afresh with optimism and enthusiasm as the service has proved its viability in the past, but average

daily child attendance has slumped to five at present which is not sustainable. Various measures for revitalising the business are being pursued and the Council discussed its options for assistance in closed session at the end of the meeting. By the time you read this, decisions may have been made. Fingers crossed...

Good news! Ownership of the Hall and its land is now as crystal clear as the Tamar in spate, with the Parish Council identified as 'Custodial Trustees'. Land Registry records will provide further useful info.

(Custodian Trustees: Village halls registered as charities are encouraged to adhere to best practice which states that title to charity property should be held in the joint names of the charity trustees. These may be (among others) a parish council or other corporate body qualified to act as a Custodian Trustee. It would have no powers of management but could be represented on the management committee.

Councillor Philip Braund will organise a hunt for an overgrown drainage pipe in Penyoke playing field where it regularly floods close to the riverside bund. Cllr Holmes reckons he knows where it is as he used to cut the grass. Here's hoping their persistence works.

Now here's essential road safety information:

- Emergency vehicles need 2.5m clear road width for access. On-street parkers please note.
- Council has invited volunteer Speed Watch Monitors to assess vehicle speeds in the parish but especially around the school. These high-vis personnel have powers to report three-time offenders to the Police. The meeting started with nine members of the public plus Mr Foot, our County Councillor. Attendance is growing...come and join in. *M Macleod*

Landulph Parish Council will hold an Extraordinary General Meeting at 7.30pm on Wednesday 31st January at Cargreen Yacht Club to discuss the Under 5s Group current issues. Members of the public are invited to attend.

Protest walk highlights dangers to local children

A good crowd of parents and children walked from Hatt via Botus Fleming to the Landulph Primary School on 5 January to highlight the dangers faced by children forced off the school bus. Walkers included the local Cornwall County Councillor, Jesse Foot. The protest was well covered by local press and media. Traffic, including tractors, vans and cars, demonstrated the dangers children as young as nine may face if they have

to walk the route daily. Deep puddles, mud and darkness all add to the difficulties. Parents also expressed fears that the remote, rural lanes would be attractive to child snatchers.

The protest walk was organised after Cornwall Council pointed out that children who lived within three miles of their school were not eligible for a free bus service. This applies to Hatt and Botus Fleming. A council official has deemed the road safe despite opposition from police, Highways and MPs. Parents can use the bus service if each family pays £80 per term.



Memorial Hall AGM

The Landulph Memorial Hall committee will hold its annual meeting on Monday 5 March at 7.00pm. The numbers attending last year were disappointing so the committee is keen to raise the level of Parish interest in the running of the Hall. It is a tremendous local asset and is managed entirely by a committee of volunteers. The committee needs support to maintain and run the Hall to the current high standard. The AGM is your opportunity to show support, put forward ideas and offer to help. If you are the official representative of a group that uses the Hall, please make every effort to attend or send a deputy.

It's 'slow ahead' for the Landulph Plan

Tamar Valley AONB are currently reviewing the Landulph Neighbourhood Development Plan. As a large part of Landulph is in the AONB it is essential that our plan works alongside theirs. We need their support in taking our plan forward.

Once we have this back it will be submitted to Cornwall Council for them to assess whether it needs to undergo a Strategic Environment Assessment. It is a long and slow process but we are in line with other parishes who are also taking the same length time as us to get a plan completed. NO S T SHERLOCK!

Another newsletter and another barrage of complaints about dog fouling in the village, especially down the bottom end of Fore Street. So, we thought you may be interested in a few canine faecal facts.

- Dog poo bins are located on the Coombe (just past the yacht club) and near the bench at the corner of Coombe Lane.
- Failure to clear up after your dog is an offence for which you may incur an on the spot penalty of £50-£80. Failure to pay this pay this can lead to a fine of up to £1000.
- You can report dog fouling on line at www.gov.uk control-dog-public.
- Councils in Barking (!!) and Dagenham have resorted to DNA testing dog mess in order to combat the problem in their parks. Responsible dog owners are encouraged to volunteer their dog's DNA in an effort to exclude their beloved pooch from the list of suspects.
- Not only is seeing / smelling/ walking in dog mess unpleasant but it can transmit an array of diseases to humans, other dogs and livestock-Salmonella, E.coli, Campylobacter, Giardia, Neospora and various worms to name but a few.

As a point of interest, the current trend to feed dogs raw meat based diets has led to a surge in Salmonella, E.coli and Campylobacter cases in dogs and their owners. The faeces of these dogs contain Salmonella levels 22 times higher than that of dogs fed cooked diets. The British Veterinary Association is so concerned by this that they have issued statements advising that:-

Assistance dogs and those belonging to owners with weakened immune systems should not be fed raw meat diets.

Dogs fed on raw meat should not be allowed to run on pastures as their faeces can be harmful to livestock.
