Playing field future in doubt

Maintenance costs for the Penyoke Playing fields are becoming prohibitively high and the Parish Council may not be able to continue supporting them in their present form.

This was the outcome of discussions at the last Parish Council Meeting on 19 October.

Chairman Gerry Stevenson said: 'Over the past two years the Parish Council has been faced with mounting expenses relating to the playground at Penyoke. The swings were replaced at considerable expense, the tractor and trailer have had to be taken out of service for reasons of health and safety, and the latest safety inspection has identified some rotting timber

The playground was initially set up and equipped with grant money for the Millennium celebrations. Since then, more equipment has been added. The Council is committed to the provision of the playground, but not necessarily in its present form. Significant investment may be needed, or the playground may have to be reduced in its size and scope. It may not be possible to replace the tractor and trailer in its present form, for example.

The Council is seeking to set up a Working Group to consult with families and other interested parties on its size and layout, and to advise on what sort of equipment would be best suited to meet future needs.

Landulph School breaks 'world record'

Solar Park funding reminder

There is still time before the 7 November deadline for parishioners and parish organisations to put forward plans for using the third tranche of funds offered by the North Wayton Solar Farm developers. They have agreed to provide an additional lump sum of £10,000 as part of the proposals for the extension of the site. The money will be given to the Landulph Parish Council for use in the parish for the benefit of the community as a whole. The Council will be discussing proposals at their meeting on 21 November.

What's the point of silage? Read on...

First of all, what is silage? Well, in a climate like ours when animals cannot graze outside all year round, farmers need a way of storing summer crops to feed to the animals in winter. Silage is stored green stuff and is preserved in large heaps (clamps) or bundles where it pickles itself and therefore doesn't decompose into the soggy black stuff that you might get in your garden compost bin. So what's the secret? Basically good silage-making relies on cutting the grass while it's relatively young, sweet and clean, allowing it to dry for no more than a day, then storing it in compressed form with oxygen excluded. To get to this point the farmer will

have avoided contaminating the crop with harmful bacteria in manure, will harvest up to three times a summer to get a young crop high in natural sugars, will mow, rake, bundle by netting into cylindrical bales, then wrap the bales in at least 4 layers of thick plastic. Ideally cutting, wilting and baling/wrapping would all be achieved in 24 hours in perfect summer weather and would have involved 4 separate tractor-powered processes with their own special implements. Farmers who prefer to store silage in clamps take the wilted grass to large open-topped enclosures where the huge heap is completely covered in thick polythene sheeting and compressed as heavily as possible to exclude air (usually topped-off with dozens of old tyres).

Once the silage is wrapped or clamped, the oxygen in the enclosed air allows a fraction of the grass's natural sugars to ferment to lactic acid which then pickles and preserves the grass for many months if necessary. When fed to the animals the silage is pale brown, slightly moist, and loosens up readily. The final day or two of this process can be hectic for the farmer, so be patient when our narrow lanes are busy with tractors and trailers.


