

#### **Parish Council**

We have not reported parish council business for some time, and would be delighted if a member of the public were to give it a go on a regular basis. More importantly, the parish council itself is faltering, with one councillor below strength since Reg's death and with Gerry ineligible for re-election following his move to Saltash. Over to you.

#### Neighbourhood Plan comes alive

The recent Focus Group meetings gave the Plan Steering Group a flavour of local views, but there is a need for wider consultation. Quite soon you will be invited to a day-long open meeting at the Hall where all and any views can be aired and novel perspectives floated. But why bother? Here's what I think. Landulph is special, not just in our affections, but when you compare it to Cornwall more generally. For example we are one of the smallest parishes in population terms, are almost a well-kept secret as we are pretty much invisible and have no through road. Our parishioners have significantly more elderly, retired, self-employed, car owners, healthy and educated folk than the Cornwall average, and fewer unemployed and deprived. Add in the AONB and our thriving clubs etc, and you realise how lucky we are. The Neighbourhood Plan will define the community's policy for future developments affecting land usage and building, and has to reflect the wishes of the majority of residents. This process puts unaccustomed power into residents' hands to shape future development so please support the Plan and attend the drop-in open meeting on Saturday 21st of May.

P.S. Apparently we're expected to think positively, i.e. to say what change we want to see happen, rather than make a list of things we forbid. How difficult is that?

#### What is 'affordable housing'

In the context of potential development within the parish of Landulph, I am often asked for a definition of the term 'affordable housing'. There is no one single definition, so let me try to clarify the situation.

#### **Social Rented Housing**

Social rented housing is owned and let by local authorities. These homes are offered at the lowest rents which are set by the Government.

#### Affordable Rented Housing

These homes are owned and let by housing associations, but higher rents can be charged (up to 80% of open market rent).

#### **Low Cost Housing for Sale**

These houses are built and sold at below market value by private developers (usually between 40% and 70% of the open market value). The property is bought at a discount, but it is sold at the same percentage value as when it was bought, so it remains affordable.

#### **Shared Ownership**

This is designed for people who cannot afford to buy on the open market. An initial share is bought (usually 24% to 75%) and then rent is paid on the remaining part. The other share in the home is owned by a housing association or a developer. When the house is sold, the proceeds are split according to who owns what. It is usually possible to buy 100% of the property outright so it becomes a traditional open market property, unless it is within a restricted village or rural area.

#### **Shared Equity**

This is a scheme usually offered by developers. It helps by providing a loan that acts as part of the deposit, and coupled with a mortgage, leads to 100% ownership.

#### **Help to Buy**

This scheme offers an interest free loan of up to 20% funded by the Government on new build properties. The purchaser has to find a deposit of 5%

The long-anticipated fifth Battens quiz took place at the end of January. As has become the norm, the Memorial Hall hosted a packed house of happy (rowdy?) Revellers. Topics this year ranged from Children's TV, through to 'O' Levels, with a smattering of Sport, General Knowledge and Trivia thrown in. A new round 'What happened Next' reminded us of the glory days of Pathe News and Superstars, and provided a smattering of comedy with wayward balls and crazy goalkeepers. It also reminded us how

much we rely on IT when the videos



decided to start playing up. (Thank you Andy for saving the day.)Half time gave the opportunity for further welcome

refreshment requiring the organisers to raid various wine cellars around the village as they had woefully underestimated the audience's Prosecco demands. Thank you to those who helped out in our hour of need!It was also the opportunity to relive the fun and games of Katie's Mega Ice Bucket Challenge which had raised over £1,200 in Summer 2014. Martin Freeman gave an update on progress made in Battens disease research, particularly with the aid of the Daniovision monitor installed at the Royal Veterinary College. This was purchased with funds raised in Katie's name. This was a record-breaking night as the total raised, with the addition of very generous donations from those unable to make it on the night, exceeded £1,600. This brings the total raised to date to a whopping £27,000. There are too many people and organisations to thank in this short report, but you know who you all are, and you know how much we appreciate all your support, so thank you.

Battens Research Update: The American Pharmaceuticals company, Biomarin, has been running a cutting-edge trial in cooperation with institutions in Europe, the UK (Great Ormond St) and US in which the enzyme missing in Battens patients has been injected directly into the brain ventricles over a period of up to 18 months.

Results of the first phase of the trial have just been published and have shown, on average, an 80% reduction in brain damage caused by the disease. This is a breakthrough moment. It is far too early to talk of a cure, but, if this therapeutic effect continues, it can very possibly buy these children (who normally die by age 9), a significant amount of time during which further scientific progress towards a cure can be made.

#### **Cowes Week for Cargreen?**

Over the past few years there have been a number of high profile collisions between yachts racing at Cowes Week and commercial shipping. Following numerous risk assessment exercises the organisers of the regatta reluctantly have decided that the event cannot continue in its current format and location and have invited other suitable racing venues to submit applications to host the event from 6 to 13 August 2016. Portland Harbour

Authority have already prepared and submitted a bid and it is understood that the Port of Plymouth Sailing Association (PPSA) is finalising its proposal document. Under that proposal, the majority of the racing would take part in Plymouth Sound, but the application also includes some racing off the quay at Cargreen, namely the Dragon, Flying Fifteen and Redwing classes and the provision of a 'tented village' in the car park of the Spaniards providing food & drink outlets and live music. If the bid is successful expect the lanes and the Parish to be busier than normal at the beginning of August. The closing date for submission of the proposals is 1 April 2016 and the PPSA should be notified if their bid is successful by mid-May.

#### Sargent's wood

Sargent's wood as it is locally named was once a thriving market garden, growing fruit and vegetables, apple, pear and cherry trees. This piece of land was part of the Pentillie Estate and is between Wayton and Stockadon valleys. You can reach it down the footpath that skirts the solar park

When it was a working garden, access was though a gate (now grown in) at the top of Highdown. The packing shed is now derelict but boxes with their labels to the midland markets, where fruit was sent via rail from Saltash Station, could once be found there.

The last tenant was Bill Sargent, after whom locals named the wood, and when he surrendered the tenancy in the 1960's the land was left to nature; over the years it has become the wood you see today. It is now full of wildlife including badger sets, and old varieties of daffodils flowering in rows as they were planted can still be seen. The cuckoo could be heard in the spring; not anymore. Sargent's wood is a wonderful example of Nature re-establishing itself.

#### Rain again (late February 2016)

We've most definitely had far too much rain this winter, gallons more than we'll ever need or use, or have space for, making life very wet and soggy. I read somewhere that if you run through the rain you stay drier/get less wet, but I'm far from convinced, maybe in a wet suit or a birthday suit, as you'd get good speed up, but fully booted and spurred, with adequate rain protection.

running is no easy feat. Plus if you want to run into the wind it goes down your neck and the front of your wellies, and

running with the wind behind you, it pushes you along; yes, but fills your wellies from the back.

The size of the raindrops affects the speed at which they hit you apparently. Fine drops travel at 2mph, medium drops go about 15mph and large ones at 18mph. Very good to know but by the time you've worked out the size of your rain drops you'll be too wet to care.



I've always been very interested in clouds and thought most of them very beautiful, but this winter I've sort of gone off them a bit, especially the Cumulo nimbus, the rain cloud, and certainly the Nimbostratus, the very prolonged downpour cloud, which I think we have had nonstop since before December; and the sight of the Mammatocumulus with its beautiful festoons of little clouds under the cumulus, heralding stormy weather, wind and torrents of rain, snow and thunder really puts you off. Yellow tinged clouds for rain, green for snow, and pink to red for, at the right time of day, sunshine. This year red sky at night has deserted us and red sky in the morning is just another days warning. Shepherds no longer get a look in!

For the birds The avocets have called, but less than most years. Lots more red shank, and shell ducks becoming more common daily. The kingfisher took to fishing from the pulpit of Joe's old boat, right at the end of our garden - fabulous, and a green sandpiper, with its flashy white tail end showing when it screeches and takes flight, has also taken a fancy to our creek. Stella and Suzann continue to call. Miss Suzann is now a beautiful white swan, despite her mother continuously flying off to the far side of the tide line, leaving her poor little grey and flightless daughter crying piteously as she scrambled and paddled down the stream to find her cruel mama. She's a great survivor. Spring's coming, and summer too, just push that bumpy old jet stream and the waves of low pressure way up somewhere higher and all will be sunshine.
