Parish Council Meeting 18th July

A lot of time was spent discussing the apparently exorbitant quote for replacement of the playground tractor and/or trailer at Penyoke, before agreeing that another quote should be sought. It seemed even more difficult to know how to respond to the outline planning application for the erection of up to five houses on land to the west of The Oaks, Coombe Drive. Councillors worried that it might conflict with the yet-unwritten Neighbourhood Plan, would set a precedent for more development on the site, and distract from brown-field development. They eventually recommended approval, with reservations. The refusal of the Crooked Spaniards Inn latest development plan was raised by a member of the public who suggested that the future of the site remain an agenda item so that the community, parish council and local authority might take the initiative in finding an acceptable outcome.

Earnest matters took a lighter twist when the chairman reported that new street signage for Penyoke Lane was implementable, but signage for Back Lane would involve a change in postcode for residents so probably was best forgotten. The chairman then described the council's frustrations in trying to improve road safety near the Stockadon junction on the A388. Imagine driving home from Saltash and cresting the hill just past the expasty shop, at which point the double white road marking becomes dotted on your side. This has allowed some dangerous overtaking and near misses, as has been pointed out to County, but apparently no action will be taken until there is an accident. Take care!

And so to prayers and to bed. *S Pepys*

Where should the Solar Park funds go?

The North Wayton Solar Farm developers have agreed to provide an additional lump sum of £10,000 as part of the proposals for the extension of the site. The money will be given to the Landulph Parish Council for use in the parish for the benefit of the community as a whole.

Landulph Parish Council are asking parishioners for their views on how the remaining funding could be spent, and have asked for this information in the following format:

- Three contractors' quotes (where possible) detailing the costings of the project
- Explain how the project would benefit the Landulph Parish community as a whole

- Deadline: 7 November 2016

Any suggestions received in this format will be considered at the Landulph Parish Council meeting on Monday 21 November at 7.30pm in the Landulph Memorial Hall Annexe, at which you will be asked to provide a five minute presentation.

Landulph Plan moves forward

Comments from the Open Day on 21 May have been analysed. The Steering Group are currently extracting themes from them with a view to drafting policies to support the Plan objectives.

Part of the evidence gathering includes a Housing Needs Survey which Cornwall Council may have already sent out by the time you are reading this. Please complete this survey, it's vital to have current information on Housing Needs. The survey can be completed online or you can pick up a paper copy from the Book Exchange in the red Telephone Box, Fore Street, Cargreen.

The Steering Group need to engage with the age group 11-18 within the Parish or coming to work in the Parish and will be posting a link to a Survey Monkey on the Landulph Innit and the Landulph Neighbourhood Plan Facebook pages as well as the website at landulphplan.org.uk. Please encourage any 11-18 year olds you know to complete this as it's really important to engage with all age groups.

Crooked Spaniard plans refused

The latest proposals for developing the Crooked Spaniard Inn have been refused by the Head of Planning at Cornwall Council, Phil Mason.

The plans, which showed eight housing units on the site in addition to the old part of the existing pub, would, 'by reason of its height and massing appear unduly dominant in its sensitive setting and would fail to protect the natural beauty of landscape of the surrounding section of the Tamar Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty'.

The rejection also raised the issue of flooding and the effect of noise and fumes on adjacent properties. It was noted that the proposed buildings would be very close to existing buildings, blocking light and degrading privacy. There was a lack of provision to mitigate impact on community infrastructure and services. The pontoon proposed for visiting boats, which had earlier been approved, was also rejected because of potential harm to local biodiversity and the lack of an 'imperative overriding public interest in

this instance'. In his summing up Phil Mason concluded 'The Local Planning Authority has acted positively in determining this application by identifying matters of concern with this proposal. On this occasion the issues are so fundamental that it is not possible to negotiate a way forward due to the harm that has been clearly identified within the reasons for refusal'.

Highlights of the event, which takes place over the weekends of 30 September, 1 and 2 October, 7 and 8 October and 14 to 16 October include international folk singer Seth Lakeman with Kathryn Roberts, a first appearance at the Festival by Gideon Barrett's shanty and folk Band *Flash Jack*, and an illustrated talk on artist, Joshua Reynolds.

Danger – rural roads kill!

Road safety charity Brake has highlighted the dangers of small country lanes like those in and around Landulph. It says six out of 10 fatal crashes happen on these types of road.

Although traffic is light, sharp bends, poor sight lines, overgrown hedges, no pavements and potholes mean the national speed limits are often far too high for safety. The charity also points out that the traffic mix: pedestrians, horses and livestock, farm machinery, cyclists and fast moving cars, is a recipe for accidents.

The charity recommends drivers always keep well below the speed limit, assume there is something or someone round each bend, take special care round bends, at brows of hills and other hazards and avoid overtaking.

In Landulph particular hazards include: the crossroads by the school where traffic should take special care and cars should be parked with road safety uppermost in mind; and the various stretches of single-track road, where courtesy and a long view help mitigate face to face situations. Gerry Stevenson, chair of the Parish Council, writes: Recently the Parish Council has been receiving complaints once again from both riders and drivers, so I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone about the rules of the road, as set out in the Highway Code, in order to avoid anyone being hurt, or angry exchanges occurring between irritated individuals.

Drivers

Be careful of horse riders, especially when overtaking. Pass wide and slowly. In this parish, horse riders are often children, so take extra care, and remember that horses may ride in double file, especially when escorting a young or inexperienced horse or rider. Be aware of horse riders' signals and heed a request to slow down or stop. Realise that all horses present a potential hazard. They can be unpredictable, despite the efforts of the rider. Be conscious that horses may be out of sight round a bend, and riders may not hear you coming.

Riders

Wear light-coloured or fluorescent clothes in daylight. Reflective clothing should be worn when riding at night or in conditions of poor visibility. These actually give drivers three more seconds in which to see you. Never ride more than two abreast, and ride in single file on narrow or busy roads, and when riding round bends. Do listen carefully for the sound of oncoming traffic round bends.

Recognition that everyone has an equal right to be on the roads, and sensible give and take by riders and drivers, particularly on the winding and narrow roads in Landulph, should lead to improved safety. Always put yourself in the mind of the other person and be aware of each situation from the other's point of view.

The Newsletter has also been asked to remind pedestrians of their responsibilities and rights under the Highway Code:
always walk facing on-coming traffic or, where possible, walk on the side of the road which gives the longest sight line, listen for traffic as well as look, avoid walking two or three abreast or in large groups
Use pavements or verges where possible

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Undermining Reported earlier in 'Facebook, Landulph innit'

'If anyone comes across two guys digging away at the cliff on the beach footpath between the Spaniards and CYC can they please ring me on 07771594416 or 847793. They are undermining my neighbour's garden looking for old bottles, please do not confront them as they have been aggressive already. We understand that the car registration, a blue Vauxhall Corsa, is not a registered vehicle and cannot be traced by the police.

Looking at the site a serious amount of soil (estimate of 3 tons maybe more) has been dug out and thrown adjacent onto the beach undermining the garden above and a large oak tree directly above. There appears to be bits of broken pottery around the spoil. Norman Watts the owner of the property above has fixed a 'Private' sign, adjacent to the area. The motive, looking for old bottles, behind this reckless/criminal act seems at this stage unclear.
