Parish Council Meeting

Playground repairs may push up rates

The playing field and playground at Penyoke have become interesting for all the wrong reasons; the play equipment in the enclosure is beginning to rot and rust after 12 years to the point where a succession of expensive replacements is already under way, but costs cannot be sustained. An application for funds from the Solar Park is likely to be made by a volunteer working group, and the PC will vote at December's meeting on raising the parish precept by 10% in order to raise approximately £1,000 per annum to cover repairs and replacements. Calm down, the extra expense per household is chickenfeed!

Street Trading A few months ago, the Parish Council asked for a complete ban on street trading in the parish, with particular concerns about car sales on Fore Street. County had looked into the matter and reported that there was insufficient proof of such an activity as there were no obvious advertised sales.

New street names There is a proposal to have Back Lane and Penyoke Lane formally recognised in addresses and with signage. This will help emergency services find individual homes - but the one resident whose postcode will have to change may not be dancing in the lane. At November's meeting one affected resident was unsure which lane was which, and all were surprised to learn that a change of street names and postcodes would have to be registered with a staggering list of departments and authorities. Later in the meeting when asked if the parish wanted to host a Cornish leg of the Tour of Britain Cycle Race it was taken as a brilliant entertainment to direct them down Back Lane!

Rosehill housing estate Potential development of the Rosehill site (where the Cloake greenhouses are) got short shrift from those who had attended or had received reports, and it seems that the Council is warming up to a robust rejection if planning consent is sought for the proposals unchanged. What's more, the Neighbourhood Plan will define the constraints on acceptability.

The deadline for submissions for Solar Park funds has been extended to Tuesday 10 January 2017; see the last two newsletters or the parish Council website for details. Funding applications should be sent to landulph-clerk@live.co.uk

Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire on its way

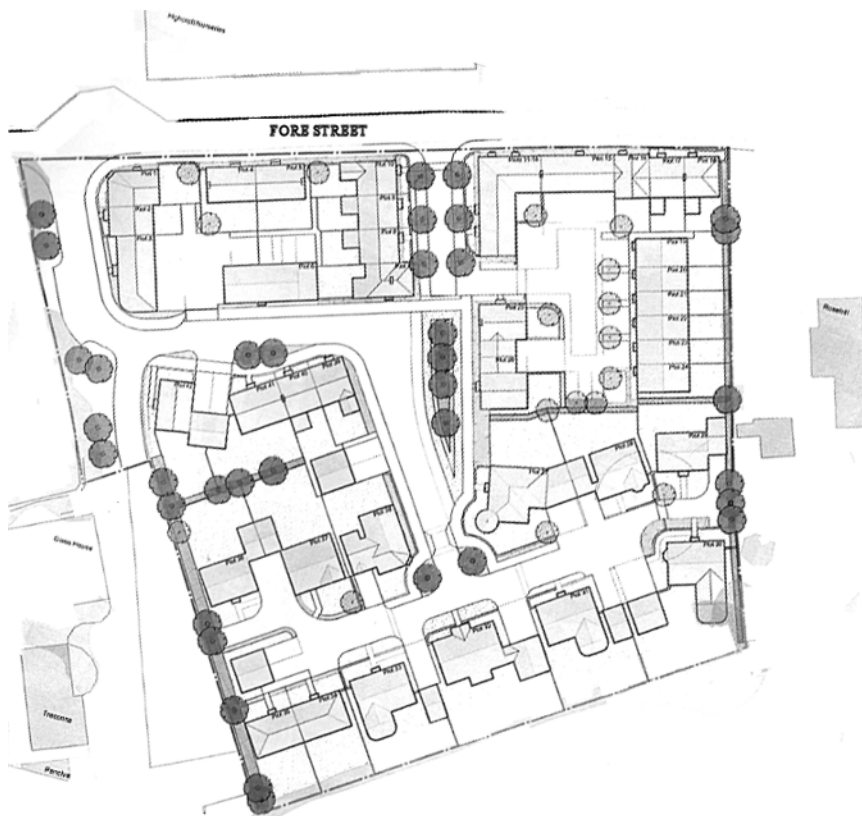

The Plan, once adopted locally and accepted by the Cornwall County Council, will have legal weight and will influence planning policy for our part of the county. The adopted plan could be a powerful tool in shaping the future look of the community and dictating the location and pace of any development. The group urges you take a few minutes now to invest in the long term future of Landulph Parish.

Rosehill development plans unveiled

The plans below show the proposals for replacing the Cloake greenhouses with 42 houses and flats including 13 'affordable' homes. The scheme, drawn up by The Landscape Practice, was unveiled at a public meeting in November and later discussed at the November Parish Council meeting (see previous page) At this stage the plans are tentative and subject to change, and will go to formal public consultation before being lodged with the Cornwall Planning Department. There will be plenty more opportunities for parishioners to express their opinions.

Our Loyal Advertisers – Richard Brown, farmer

Richard's father took on the tenancy of the Duchy-owned Park Farm (opposite the school) in 1957, and that's where Richard grew up and learned his skills. Richard has concentrated on raising beef and lamb. His cattle are an American hybrid called Stabiliser, which has the qualities of cool temperament, rapid growth, easy calving and excellent meat. They're a favourite with Morrison's supermarket which would buy direct from Richard if he could supply enough regular truckloads, but he has no trouble finding buyers within Cornwall. See his advert and the attractive offer of jointed cuts. In addition to his Duchy tenancy he has fortunately been able to rent land from Ted Coryton and family which has enabled him to grow his beef herd to about 300 animals.

There's also a flock of about 100 Dorset-cross sheep. Now here's the clever bit; the rams and bulls work to a strict duty roster so that lambing happens in January and February which means that once the lambing shed is cleared the cows then come in to calve, and later, when the 18-week old lambs are sent to market, the pasture recovers well enough to graze the cattle through the summer. It's family planning, but not as we know it!

Among the delights of the farming year are the visits of the pre-school children to see the lambs. Less obvious to the rest of us are Prince Charles' private meetings with his tenant farmers in the South West, and a special treat for Richard –a visit to the Prince's home at Highgrove. Royal connections don't end there; Richard's parents and other Duchy tenants were introduced to the Queen during her visit to Landulph in 1962, which his mother remembers with delight.
