



LANDULPH PARISH COUNCIL CLIMATE CHANGE STATEMENT OF INTENT

Landulph Parish Council supports Cornwall Council's initiative to become carbon neutral by 2030. To avoid exceeding 1.5 degrees C, target global net CO2 emissions must decline by 45% by 2030 reaching net 0 around 2050.

The Parish Council will work actively to encourage parishioners to embrace the subject and will keep themselves updated of any relevant changes and initiatives that can be implemented within the parish.

Parish Council - Roles and Responsibilities:

Landulph Parish Council will:

- Ensure developers adhere to policies to support climate change measures when building new housing developments. Alterations and extensions to existing property that require planning consent should also be encouraged to support the best practice.
- Actively encourage and educate on good waste management, encouraging the 5 key requirements: 1. Refuse 2. Reduce 3. Re-use 4. Recycle 5. Rot.
- Encourage solar and wind power where appropriate.
- Actively accept the battery storage facility within the parish and work with Pivot Power to educate the parish regarding its importance.
- Encourage car-sharing schemes to help minimise carbon emissions.
- Encourage 'Hopper' Bus or similar to the parish.
- Increase biodiversity and tree planting on any Parish Council owned ground.
- Review opportunities to “green” Parish Council owned buildings ie Landulph Memorial Hall, including additional solar panels, LED lighting, low carbon emission heating system, building insulation, phase out use of all single use plastics, investigate water saving equipment, waste recycling, purchasing of consumables etc
- Encourage a regular clean-up of the local shoreline and roadways.
- Work in partnership with Landulph School to encourage good 'green' practices and initiatives.
- Provide support to farmers and market gardens as appropriate.
