Parish Council October

Public Forum A member of the public questioned the planning application for two dwellings at Landulph Cross. The timing of Parish Council meetings meant that this had been considered as a 'delegated decision'. Perhaps the application's timing was tactical, but the Chair said that there were no public comments on Cornwall Council's planning web site. Tamar Valley AONB had objected, Highways was sitting on the fence, but the PC had no objections. The Chair concluded that the correct process had been followed.

Planning An application to replace a Nissen-type hut next to 'Newlyn' in Church Lane with a bungalow was supported. The hut had been used by a farm worker years ago, and still contained a tin bath and dart board. The Council felt this was a replacement for an existing building, not infill or rounding-off of the village. The application did not address carbon neutrality, but this was not enforceable.

Landulph Parish Climate Action Group reported feeling smug as they had been judged to be 12 months ahead of similar groups in the area. Taxi use The PC had been asked to complete a questionnaire about licensed vehicles in Caradon – (hackney carriages, not mobile bars!) The number of licensed vehicles is fixed and they are restricted to a set area – Caradon in our case. The questionnaire was confusing about the distinction between, and need for, private hire taxis and hackneys, but the council filled it in on-line, stressing there was no public transport and taxis of any kind were usually difficult to get. (For information: hackneys can be hailed, private taxis must be booked.)

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Would Landulph be arranging formal celebrations of the event? A Working Group was proposed and would involve other village organisations (Hall Committee, Yacht Club, school etc). The Gardening Club would be delighted to help with the three-colour flower planting. The Chair promised an update soon.

Defibrillator training had been delayed but was now expected after Christmas. Multiple sessions would be needed.

There was an initiative by the County Council to raise awareness about support for **care in the community**. We should expect something soon about services available, and about recognising need. The PC agreed that, should it go ahead, they would underwrite the cost of hire of the Memorial Hall. Finally, there is urgent consultation going on about the **Saltash Leisure Centre**. The message was 'use it or lose it', and the Chair had both visited and signed up for membership. A thousand members are needed and only 464 are currently signed up.

International boules The game of petanque/boules had been lost to the Breton group, Nordet, who had un-nerved our team by singing!

Parish Council November

Three **planning applications** were given the Council's approval. A first floor extension to the bungalow at Treconna, Rosehill Nurseries, not only looked fine but few would know where it was, let alone see it. The window extension at Southbound Slip was better than suggested in the pre-app, though the Council still liked the planners' suggestion of supporting brackets. Finally a garden machinery store for the boarding kennels was well out of sight.

The Council has received a 125-page report on the **Recreation Ground** play area. At a cost of about £1 per page, this report was considered extraordinary value for money. However, councillors mused that perhaps it had lost a sense of proportion – never mind the quality, feel the width! The Council will deal with the 'red lines', then consider the remainder. The fence around the area is not essential, but is there to keep dogs out. Notices to this effect were in place, but some parishioners and visitors needed to be reminded.

Councillors had discussed signage at **Spaniards Quay** with the County Council's Footpath Officer. He agreed the changes to make the signs accurate. A parishioner had also suggested putting a hand rail on the public steps down to the foreshore. This is being pursued, but as a consequence the life-ring will need to be moved a few feet onto the Spaniards car park.

Footpaths The stile near Salter's Mill had been fixed by the landowner, but water-logging at Paradise Lane needed to be formally reported by a parishioner. There were now plans for a Parish Walk later this year. The suggestion to hold an event for the **Platinum Jubilee** was shedding moss and starting to roll, with the identification of suitable organisers. On to the 'C' word....the PC would again be putting up a Christmas tree and lights at the crossroads to make you feel festive.

Precept In the last few years,Landulph has had high precept (parish rates)increases to generate a reserve fund should the play area need replacing.

Lockdowns had affected plans, but this fund would be considered as part of the precept proposals. Figures for representative precept increases were shown, and unbelievably suggested that a 2% increase would give a reduction in charge to a Band D property. Watch this space! Did you know that 14% of those who live in Cornwall identify as being Cornish? Neither did most of us (86% in fact), but the Framework Convention for the Protection of National Minorities had been communicated to the Council, who duly noted it.

Exploding Hedgehogs!

Hedgehogs are classed as 'vulnerable' in the UK because their population has fallen rapidly, but Cargreen seems to have a population explosion. Monty the cat first discovered a strange creature in our courtyard. We moved it but a few days later two babies (hoglets) were wandering about in the davtime. Another baby got trapped by the front door and screamed very loudly! We contacted 'International Rescue - Hedgehog Division' who said: 'Nest too small; Mum probably not feeding them properly; make another shelter; put some cat food down.' I put an unused cat box out, plus a pukka nest from Carkeel with a load of hay and a trail camera. The camera showed three



babies plus Mum, but she started sleeping outside in a totally different corner. I put a slate roof over her, but the trail camera showed the problem - not just three babies, but six! We bought



shares in chicken cat food, and industrial quantities of cat biscuits. Four or five bowlfuls would disappear each night as well as the same amount of water.

This was all

happening in a sunken courtyard, so the hogs were effectively trapped. HR (Hedgehog Rescue) advised that the babies need to reach hibernation weight (about 1/2Kg) before we let them escape. I started building ramps, but the first hoglet to try one slipped at the top and fell over the edge. Back to the drawing board! Now six growing babies plus Mum divided by four nests equals not enough nests... so we bought another. However we started seeing bluebottle flies - hardly surprising - the amount of food equalled a lot of hedgehog poo! HR thought differently - either we had a dead baby or the hoglets had fly-strike (fly maggots around the anus!). They suggested we open all nests, check Mum and surviving babies, put them back with clean straw and take any problem animals to them. We made a plan. Libby and wildlife-savvy friend Amanda would weigh and examine. I would attack the virgin jungle to reach the nests. The original nest turned out to be tiny – a slate covering a hole barely big enough for one hog let alone a family! One hoglet was at home, but the top of the slate was the communal toilet and source of the flies. Don't know what he had done to deserve that! Second nest, two hedgehogs; repurposed cat basket, three hedgehogs; six in total. On to the final nest... four hedgehogs! So we've got 10 in total, no dead ones, all healthy and above hibernation weight except two only just under. No wonder they were eating so much cat food! So, were they massing ready to take us by storm? We'll never know. With the ramp up to the rest of the garden now installed, the rate of cat

food consumption has gone down. Presumably some at least have escaped. However, there is at least one other hedgehog living elsewhere in the garden, at least three next door and more in all sorts of places like Cumple Park (Slow Hedgehog not sure why hedgehogs are slow up there!) and in Coombe Drive. Perhaps they are bent on world domination after all. I'm also sure I heard one shouting 'Dinsdale' ... (and if you are under 60, just google Spiny Norman!)

PS. If you want to feed hedgehogs, you need dried cat biscuits with chicken for adults, cheap chicken cat food in jelly for hoglets and a *lot* of clean water.

Mavis Edmonds 1940 - 2021

Those who attended Mavis' funeral heard the story of her busy life, written by herself for the family. She was born at Duchy Home Farm, Stoke Climsland, near Callington. Mavis left school aged 16 and worked on the family farm, but amazingly had played the church organ throughout her life from the age of 13. As a teenager she also immersed herself in organisations including the Methodist Church, a youth club and Landrake Young Farmers Club (YFC). In 1958 at the Royal Cornwall show Mavis was presented to the Queen Mother when she visited the YFC tent. Mavis became secretary and treasurer of YFC while still a youngster: her own biopic says 'whatever organisation I've joined I seem to end up as secretary or treasurer'. After marriage to David in 1962 they moved to the Stockadon



area of Landulph. They had two children, Nigel and Nikki. Mavis immersed herself in their market garden business, local organisations, and developed a deepening fascination with local history. The community owes her enduring gratitude for her treasurership of the Memorial Hall for 28 years, her contributions during 13 years as a parish councillor (five as chairman) during which Caradon District Council appointed her to represent towns and parishes on the new Standards Committee. This all makes her sound like a formidable mover & shaker but those who knew her will carry warm memories of her kind and unassuming personality. Her skills at raising grant aid helped many organisations develop and succeed. Last but not least the newsletter is grateful to her as a founding member and for her several historical articles, eg the February/March 2008 edition carries histories of the Pentillie estate, and of the school war memorial clock.

There are two defibrillators located within our parish, both for public use in an emergency.

- 1. Landulph Memorial Hall in Fore Street
- 2. Cargreen Yacht Club, Coombe Lane.

Landulph Memorial Hall defibrillator:

Located adjacent to front doors

To use you are required to input the code 1111 to unlock, and press the green 'tick' button to open for access.

Cargreen Yacht Club defibrillator

Located on the front wall of the building before you reach the front doors.

This unit is left unlocked, and so no unlock code is required.

Please remember in the event that you may need to use one of the above units, that in a cardiac arrest situation: **continuous CPR is essential while someone else goes to obtain the defibrillator.**
