Celebrating Tamara

Key outputs

Two large-scale celebration events, 400 participants engaged

90 events on the themes of art heritage, the seasons and local produce and activities on the water, 1,000 participants engaged

500 volunteer hours contributed

500 first time visitors to the TLP project who live on its borders





Tamara trainees

Key outputs

11 foundation courses, 6 internships & 5 apprenticeships

All paid at living wage

Over 80% attendance and completion

Increased levels of participant employment in relevant industries in the Tamar Valley within 12 months of completion





River Explorers

Key outputs

Engage and inspire a minimum of 10 schools within the project area with their local waterway

250 citizen scientists recruited, trained and supported to carry out water surveys, monitoring for water quality, wildlife and pollution

Two 'River Blitzes', events bringing together local and national organisations

10 parish roadshows, connecting communities through water-themed events
