ACTIVITIES TO REPORT	<p>10th October 2023 meeting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community Winter Talks. Two talks are being considered. One for February 5th and one for March 4th. To be held in the Memorial Hall. 7pm – 9pm. Audience to consist of residents, neighbouring parishes, local farmers. • First topic - Food Waste Management (to coincide with the Council’s Food waste collection service). This will also encompass reuse, reduce and recycling • Second topic – Green Food Production. • NATURE RECOVERY. Following an invitation by Tom Derham, the group hopes to visit this farm again to see how regenerative farming is working as the year progresses. We would also like to arrange a visit to Haye Farm to further expand our understanding and promote links between the parish and its farms. • A review of the Tamar Valley ANOB Nature Recovery Plan has been produced highlighting potential opportunities for LCG to support the plan and incorporate aims into our strategic intents and actions. • The noticeboard at Coombe corner has pictures promoting some of the special species highlighted in the Tamar Valley AONB Nature Recovery Plan. We hope to encourage residents in the parish to report any relevant viewings of these species to support the AONB. • Hedgerows within the Parish. The group wish to conduct a survey of hedgerows within the area designated for our community top orchard. We wish to identify and record the habitat prior to work beginning on the orchard so that we can protect, manage and improve it over time. • Temperate Rainforests within the local area. The group is planning to visit and record a potential site close to our Parish boundary. We are co-ordinating dates with the land owner’s representative. • PUBLIC TRANSPORT. The recent public transport competition proved a great success for promoting and publicising use of public transport. Unfortunately it didn’t attract as many entries as we would like but we have awarded four prizes for best diary and best picture in both over 8 years and under 8 years. A certificate and prize was awarded to the winner of the best diary (over 8 years at Landulph School on 9 October in the School Assembly. Other winners have been

We are hoping to hold one of our meetings at Drakewalls, where Tamar Valley AONB are based. • We continue to keep in touch with our friends at Bere Ferrers Parish Council and look forward to inviting them to the winter talks. • We are looking at both Nature Recovery Plans for Cornwall Council and TV AONB to check for duplication and identify what is relevant for Landulph.
